Masks Are Still Required Inside City Hall for All

For the continued health and safety of the public and City staff, the City will continue to require individuals entering City facilities in Burlingame to wear a mask. Therefore, while the County lifted the indoor mask mandate for fully vaccinated individuals effective February 16, the City will continue to require masks in order to enter City facilities.


The San Mateo Union High School District is Transitioning to By-Trustee Area Elections

Like so many public agencies in the Bay Area and State of California, the San Mateo Union High School District is transitioning to by-trustee area elections. This will:

- Prevent an at-large election system from diluting minority voting power, and protect the ability of minorities to influence the outcome of an election.
- Create maps to balance the population of the District into five voting areas while enhancing minority voting rights.
- Allow voters to elect a single Board member from the trustee area they live in, which can lower the costs of candidates running for School Board.
