Candidate Filing for the November 8, 2022 Election Opens Monday, July 18

The November 8, 2022 election will be the City's first district based election, with candidates for District 1, District 3, and District 5 on the ballot. Registered voters will now vote only for the Council seat in their district. To find which district you live in, go to

www.burlingame.org/districtelections.

Individuals who wish to run for one of the three seats on the November ballot must:

- Be a registered voter and live in the district in which they are running
- Set up an appointment with the City Clerk by email: <u>mhasselshearer@burlingame.org</u> or phone: 650-558-7203 to begin the candidate filing process
- Complete all necessary paperwork and file with the City Clerk's office between July 18 and August 12

The County Elections Office is holding a candidate seminar on July 22 at 2:00 p.m. This seminar will cover important topics including filing deadlines, filing forms, candidate statement, campaign finance reports, and voter data. Broadway Grade Separation Community Feedback

On Wednesday, July 13, the City of Burlingame and Caltrain jointly hosted a virtual community meeting to discuss aesthetics for the Broadway Grade Separation and Train Station Project. To access the recording of the meeting, <u>click</u> here.



The Broadway railroad crossing has high traffic volumes, resulting in some of the worst traffic congestion in the region. In 2017, the Burlingame City Council approved a preferred design alternative that will separate the train tracks from the road, improve safety, eliminate train gate downtime at the crossing, reduce horn noise, improve overall system operations, and improve traffic flow. As part of the project, a new elevated Broadway Station will be built, with undeted amonities that better party the



with updated amenities that better serve the community.

Community Resource Centers for Public Safety Power Shutoffs

In the event of a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS), residents will have access to Community Resource Centers throughout San Mateo County.

Each Community Resource Center will have an ADA-accessible restroom and handwashing station, outlets, Wi-Fi, bottled water, ice, snacks, air conditioning/heating, and seating.

July is Plastic Free Month

Welcome to <u>Plastic Free July</u> - a movement to reduce single use plastic waste. Simple actions can greatly reduce our plastic pollution problem, such as avoiding plastic straws, bringing your own bag to shopping, using reusable utensils in place of plastic ones, and choosing products not packaged in plastic.



Plastics are made from fossil fuels and are rarely recycled. Studies have shown that only about 10% of plastics get recycled. Most plastics end up in landfills, as litter, and in our oceans.

California recently passed a cutting edge law requiring all packaging in the state to be recyclable or compostable by 2032. The legislation is expected to shift the plastic pollution burden from consumers to the plastics industry.


Burlingame on the Avenue

National Night Out


August 2, 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
