Voting Center at City Hall for the June 7, 2022 Election

The voting period is well under way for the June 7, 2022 Statewide Direct Primary Election. The City Clerk has some helpful tips to ensure that your ballot is cast and counted in this election.

Vote-by-Mail Ballots - All registered voters were sent their ballots in May. If you didn't receive your ballot in the mail, contact the San Mateo County Elections Office (650-312-5222) for more information.



Two 24/7 Ballot Boxes - The City has two permanent ballot boxes that you can utilize to cast your ballot directly with the County Elections Office

- outside City Hall, 501 Primrose Road, on the Primrose side of Burlingame City Hall
- on Broadway Avenue at 1160 Broadway

11-Day Vote Center – City Hall, 501 Primrose Road, will act as an 11-day vote center with the following hours:

- May 28 to June 6 (including weekends and holidays): 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- June 7 (Election Day): 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

4-Day Vote Center – McKinley Elementary School, Multipurpose Room, 701 Paloma Avenue, with the following hours:

- June 4 to June 6: 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- June 7 (Election Day): 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Notice of Fuel Reduction in Mills Canyon

The City of Burlingame Parks and Recreation Department has partnered with CAL FIRE work crews to reduce the fuel load in Mills Canyon. Work is scheduled for every Wednesday and Thursday in June. The crew will be removing dead vegetation, low branches, invasive species, and other materials that significantly contribute to the fuel load. On these dates, the Ed Taylor Loop Trail will be closed from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00

p.m. Please do not record, photograph, or speak to the work crews while they are working. If you wish to speak to someone on-site, please speak to City staff that are on-site or the CAL FIRE Captain.

Accordingly, the City asks that you sweep leaves toward the middle of the street the day before your street sweeping day.

Upcoming Overnight U.S. 101 Closures

- Sunday, June 5 (1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.), Northbound U.S. 101 from Millbrae Avenue to San Bruno Avenue

As a part of the San Mateo 101 Express Lanes Project, Caltrans is replacing overhead sign structures (that span the width of one side of the freeway, from the shoulder to the median) on U.S. 101. This work requires large flatbed trucks to deliver the sign structures and cranes to hoist them into place from the center of the freeway. Therefore, it will be necessary to close one direction of the freeway at a time for up to five hours. In total, four closures will be required.

Existing sign structures are being replaced by wider structures that can accommodate the new Express Lanes throughout the corridor.

June 5 Closure

During this closure, the following freeway ramps will be closed:

- Northbound U.S. 101 On-Ramp from Millbrae Avenue
- Northbound U.S. 101 On-Ramp from SFO
- Northbound U.S. 101 Off-Ramp to San Bruno Avenue/Westbound I-380 Connector
