CALTRAIN ELECTRIFICATION

Burlingame Caltrain Crossing Closure Notice

From March 14 to April 2, Caltrain will perform signal cutover work at 17 grade crossings in Burlingame and San Mateo. This work will require temporary closures of the Bayswater Avenue and North Lane railroad crossings and the Morrell Avenue pedestrian crossing. Crossing gates will not be activated at all railroad crossings in Burlingame and San Mateo during this time, but flaggers will be present to direct traffic through all other intersections.

The closures are from **12:01 a.m. on March 19 to 8 a.m. on March 20** and from **12:01 a.m. on March 26 to 8 a.m. on March 27.** In addition, from **March 27th to April 2nd**, testing will occur that may result in additional closures of the Bayswater Avenue, North Lane, and Morrell Avenue pedestrian railroad crossings.

Caltrain Service Information

Temporary service changes in the weekday morning and late afternoon schedules (5:30-9 am and 3:30-7 pm) will be in effect. The work will require a reduction in peak-hour service and suspension of Baby Bullet service. The current 104 weekday trains will be reduced to 88. Weekday middays, evenings, and weekend service remain unchanged. For more information on service changes, please visit <u>www.caltrain.com/March2022</u>.

Trains are single-tracking through Broadway, Burlingame, San Mateo, Hayward Park, and Hillsdale stations for three weeks, affecting passenger boarding. Riders using those stations should be sure to pay attention to signage and announcements to make sure they are waiting at the correct platform at the station.




Active Adult Day Trip to the Oakland Zoo

The Burlingame Neighborhood Network (BNN) invites you to learn how to use the **Zello push-to-talk app** on your smartphone. Zello will make it easier to communicate easily with others during an emergency.



BNN is inviting Burlingame residents to participate in a new BNN Zello "Net" that will be held twice a month. This will help foster stronger relationships among neighborhoods that participate in the Burlingame Disaster Survival Drill each October.

The Zello app enables you to stay in touch during an emergency as long as you have Wi-Fi or a cellular connection. Zello has more than 150 million users worldwide in at least 200 countries. It is used by first responders, families, neighbors, and businesses. Best of all, it is free.

It's easy to get started. After setting up contacts with whom you wish to communicate, you merely push a button on your smartphone screen to talk to a group on a shared channel.
