CALTRAIN ELECTRIFICATION



PARALLELING STATION CONSTRUCTION NOTICE
[March 30, 2022](#)

Starting as soon as March 30, Caltrain will begin construction of the first main gantry structure at the Paralleling Station facility currently under construction in Burlingame. Gantries are H-frame steel structures that support wires perpendicular to the tracks. These wires connect to the overhead contact system and provide power to the trains. The main gantry will be housed within the footprint of the facility near the transformers. The other gantry will be located on the opposite side of the tracks from the facility. A sample photo of a main gantry is located on the reverse side.

The Paralleling Station is an unmanned facility that will regulate electrical power to the electric trains. In addition to the gantries, the Paralleling Station will consist of:

- One transformer- The transformer will take in and convert power to ensure it is consistently sent out throughout the system.
- Control House - Located within the facility footprint, housing the controls for the system.

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

In addition to delivery of and installation of gantries via a crane, construction activities during this time will include excavation, laying of a concrete pad, control house construction, transformer delivery. Crews will utilize excavation equipment, and dump trucks for removal and delivery of materials.

A majority of the work will take place during the weekday between 6 a.m. and 3 p.m. There may be night and weekend work required when work is being completed within the railroad track envelope.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Over the last decade, Caltrain has experienced a substantial increase in ridership and anticipates further increases in ridership demand as the Bay Area's population grows. Caltrain Electrification, scheduled to be operational by 2024, will electrify and upgrade the performance, operating efficiency, capacity, safety and reliability of Caltrain's commuter rail service.

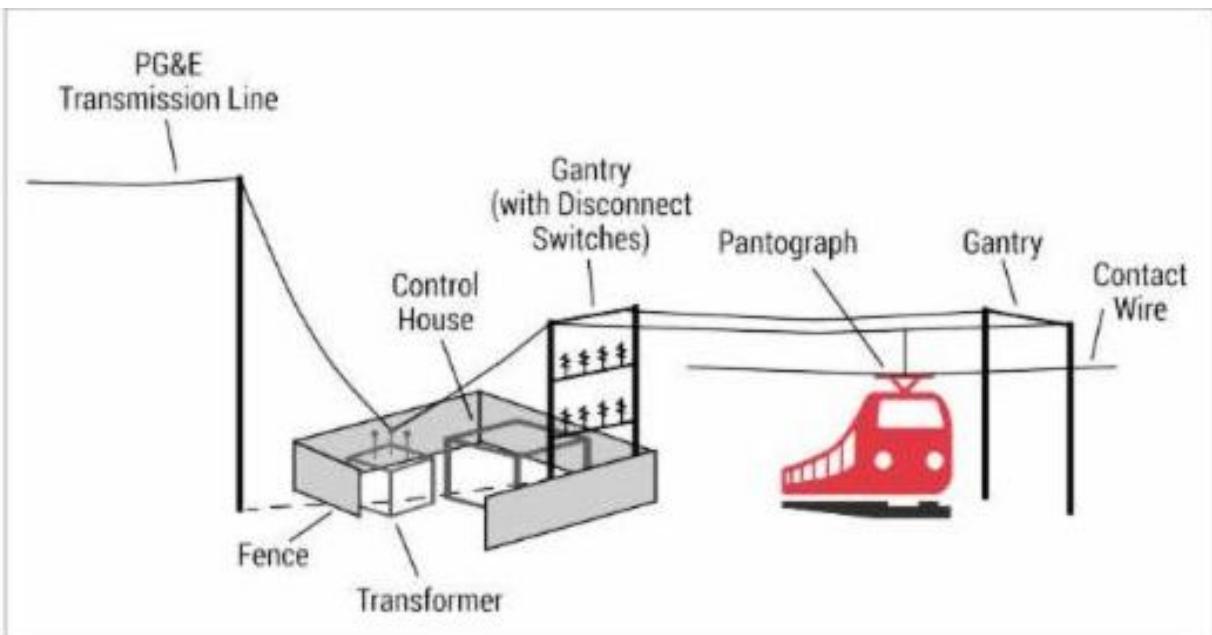
Caltrain electrification is a key component of the Caltrain Modernization Program and consists of replacing diesel-hauled with Electric Multiple Unit (EMU) train system for services between Fourth and King Street Station in San Francisco and the Tamien Station in San Jose. The project will include the installation of new electrical infrastructure and the purchase of electric vehicles.

Start saving water and energy in your home with a DIY toolkit offered at the Burlingame Main Library. Residents may loan out the toolkit filled with free equipment for residents to keep. The kits include:

- LED light bulb
- Weatherstripping
- Outlet gaskets
- A low-flow showerhead
- Faucet aerators



The kit also contains very cool household tools (that must be returned with the kit) such as a Kill-A-Watt meter to check the energy use of appliances and an infrared laser thermometer to check for heat loss.

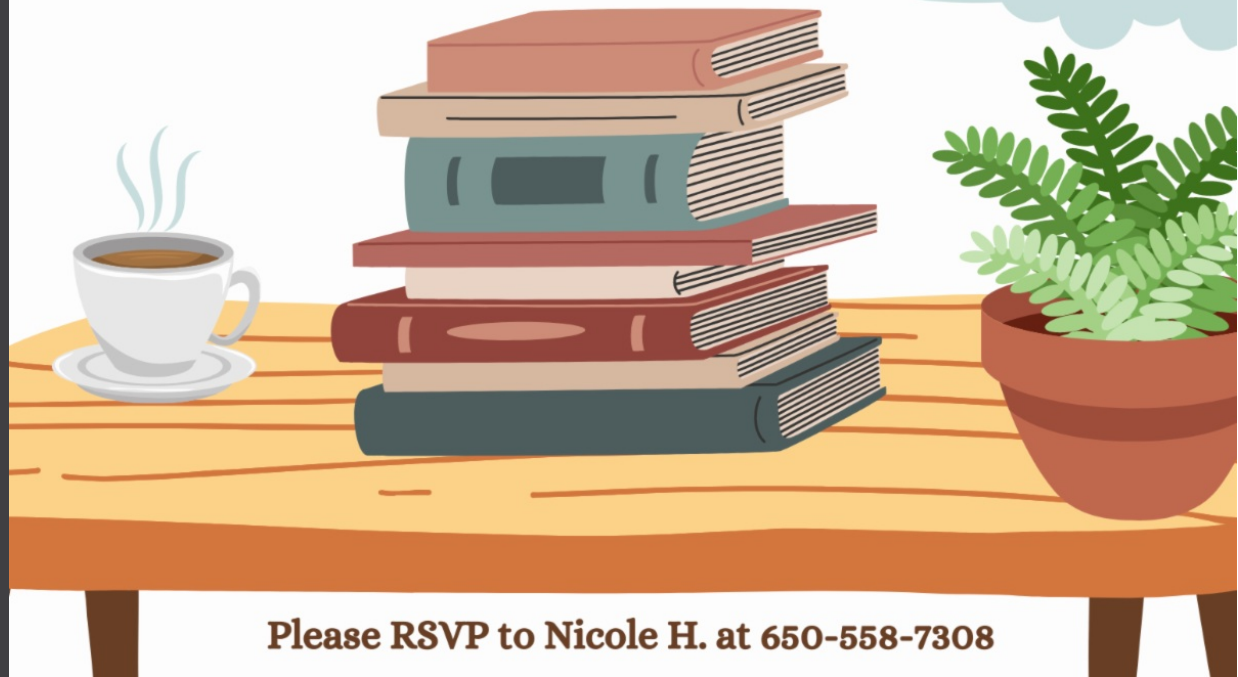

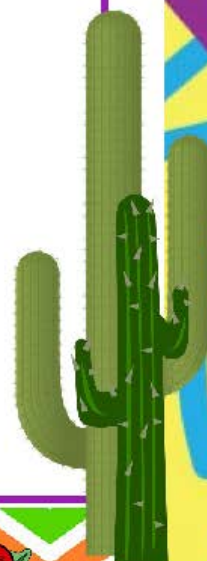

California Microbusiness COVID-19 Relief Grant Deadline is Monday, April 11

The California Office of the Small Business Advocate has released new grant funding to benefit microbusinesses in San Mateo County. The first-round deadline to apply is Monday, April 11, 2022.

To receive this grant, you must:

1. Have a business located in San Mateo County
2. The business must have started before December 31, 2019
3. The business must have been the main source of the business owner's income in 2019
4. The business must be legally operating (i.e. paying sales tax, registered with the state as appropriate)
5. The business must have fewer than five employees (in 2019, 2020 and now)
6. Have gross revenues (sales) under \$50,000 in 2019 taxable year
7. Demonstrate at least a 10% decrease in revenues from 2019 to 2020.
8. Not have received the California Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant. If you received PPP, EIDL or any county grant, you are still eligible, if you meet the other criteria.
