Help Us Keep Our Streets Clean

The City of Burlingame's street sweepers come through your neighborhood during weekdays, to sweep your streets. Since many residents are working remotely, there are more cars parked on the street, which makes it difficult for our sweepers to sweep the leaves. Accordingly, the City asks that you sweep leaves toward the middle of the street, the day before your street sweeping day.

During the spring and summer months (April through September), street sweeping is normally performed every other week. However, due to COVID, during the spring and summer months, street sweeping **may** be performed on a weekly basis.

Watch Out for the Upcoming Tree Removal


June 8 - 10

Third Annual Graduation Celebration!


What began during the pandemic as a way to recognize our students' accomplishments has turned into an annual event!

Burlingame Crossing Closure Notice

Caltrain is performing signal cutover work at 17 grade crossings in Burlingame and San Mateo through May 20.

CALTRAIN SERVICE INFORMATION

Temporary service changes in the weekday morning and late afternoon schedules (5:30 a.m. - 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. - 7:00 p.m.) will be in effect. The work will require a reduction in peak-hour service and suspension of Baby Bullet service. The current 104 weekday trains will be reduced to 88. Weekday midday and evening service as well as weekend service remain unchanged. For more information on service changes, please visit www.caltrain.com/May2022.

Trains are single-tracking through Broadway, Burlingame, San Mateo, Hayward Park, and Hillsdale stations for three weeks, which affects passenger boarding. Riders using those stations should pay attention to signage and announcements to make sure they are waiting at the correct platform.




Surprising Recycling Facts

Sharpen your recycling habits and check out our list of surprising items that can actually be recycled or composted instead of trashed:

- Wine corks made from real cork (vs. plastic) go in the green compost bin.
- Cardboard pizza boxes and ice cream containers go in the green compost bin.
- **Light bulbs and batteries** never go in the trash bin. Instead take them to Home Depot, Target, or any location with designated recycling bins.
- **Plastic bags** can be recycled at designated recycling bins in Safeway, Burlingame City Hall, and the Main Library.
- **Electronics** should stay out of the landfill and be taken to <u>Green Citizen</u> or the <u>Shoreway Environmental Center</u> to be recycled.

Be aware of confusing recycling <u>symbols on plastics</u>. The chasing arrow-triangle (pictured below) on the underside of plastic products indicates the type of plastic it is made from and does not mean the item is recyclable. Plastics #1 and #2 (like water bottles and laundry detergent bottles) are generally recycled. Plastics #3-7 are very difficult to recycle. Avoid these plastics when possible since they end up in landfill.

Celebrate Bike Month by riding <u>wherever</u> – to shops, parks, school, work, or just around town. Some ways to enjoy biking in Burlingame:

- Find the Fix-it station with tools to fine tune your bicycle. There is a Fix-it station by the Burlingame Main Library and at Burlingame Point.
- Utilize one of Burlingame's many bike lanes, including one on Carolan Avenue and one on California Drive
- Ride along the Bay Trail and enjoy beautiful views and coffee stops.
- Try out the electric bikes for rent at participating hotels (Embassy Suites, San Francisco Airport Marriott Waterfront, Hyatt, and DoubleTree)

Remember to stay safe. Wear a helmet, ride in bike lanes or on shared roadways, and keep an eye out for cars and pedestrians.

Upcoming Overnight U.S. 101 Closures

- Sunday, May 22 (1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.), Southbound U.S. 101 from South Airport Boulevard to San Bruno Avenue
- Sunday, June 5 (1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.), Northbound U.S. 101 from Millbrae Avenue to San Bruno Avenue

As part of the San Mateo 101 Express Lanes Project, Caltrans is replacing overhead sign structures (that span the width of one side of the freeway, from the shoulder to the median) on U.S. 101. This work requires large flatbed trucks to deliver the sign structures and cranes to hoist them into place from the center of the freeway. Therefore, it will be necessary to close one direction of the freeway at a time for up to five hours. In total, four closures will be required.

Existing sign structures are being replaced by wider structures that can accommodate the new Express Lanes throughout the corridor.

May 22 Closure

During this closure, the following freeway ramps will be closed:

- Southbound U.S. 101 On-Ramp from Produce Avenue
- Southbound U.S. 101 Off-Ramp to Westbound I-380
- Southbound U.S. 101 Off-Ramp to San Bruno Avenue/SFO/ North Access Road



June 5 Closure

During this closure, the following freeway ramps will be closed:

- Northbound U.S. 101 On-Ramp from Millbrae Avenue
- Northbound U.S. 101 On-Ramp from SFO
- Northbound U.S. 101 Off-Ramp to San Bruno Avenue/Westbound I-380 Connector

"Depolarizing Within: A Braver Angels Workshop"


Wednesday, May 25, 2022, 12 noon - 2 pm, via Zoom
