Caltrain Electrification Construction in San Mateo and Burlingame

As a part of Caltrain Electrification, construction crews have installed a new signal system that controls the gates at vehicular and pedestrian grade crossings in San Mateo and Burlingame. On Saturday, September 17 and Sunday, September 18, from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m., crews will install software updates and test the gates at all crossings in San Mateo and Burlingame. During this time, the crossing gates may be down for up to five minutes, and test trains will run, to ensure proper functioning of the crossing gates. Flaggers will be present at the crossings to manage traffic.

If you notice irregularities in gate downtimes, please call Transit Police at 1(877) 723-7245. The phone number is also posted on large blue signs, located on several structures around the crossing. About the Project

Caltrain Electrification is a key component of the Caltrain Modernization Program that will electrify the Caltrain Corridor from San Francisco's 4th and King Station to approximately the Tamien Station in San Jose and replace diesel-hauled trains with electric trains. Caltrain Electrification will improve Caltrain system performance, enable more frequent and/or faster train service, and reduce long-term environmental impacts by reducing noise, improving regional air quality, and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. Caltrain Electrification is scheduled to be operational by 2024.

The City is seeking applicants to fill three seats on the Beautification Commission and three seats on the Parks and Recreation Commission. Two of the Beautification Commission seats are for three-year terms, while one is for a two-year term as one of the Commissioners stepped down from the Commission part-way through her term. All three Parks and Recreation Commission seats are for three-year terms. As an incumbent elected not to reapply to this Commission, the deadline is being extended.






Burlingame's 2022 Bayfront Cleanup

10th Annual Burlingame Disaster Response Drill

Burlingame residents are invited to sign up by **September 20** for Burlingame's 10th annual Disaster Response Drill, which will take place in neighborhoods throughout the city from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 8. The event is free, all supplies are provided, and you will be equipped with skills to help you survive a major disaster.

To sign up, send an email to <u>info@burlingamenetwork.org</u> with your name and street address and indicate whether you want to lead a block or join another group. You will be contacted by a Burlingame Neighborhood Network (BNN) representative. There is no charge, and all supplies will be provided.


The drill is hosted by BNN and supported by the Central County Fire Department, the Burlingame Police Department, Burlingame CERTs, and local HAM radio operators. At this in-person, outdoor drill, participants will practice organizing in teams to help one another after a simulated earthquake and will learn how to report major incidents to a simulated emergency operations center.

No experience is necessary to participate. Neighborhood leads and anyone interested are invited to a drill walk-through training from 7:00 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, September 21; the Zoom link is: https://tinyurl.com/BNNWalk-Thru. Neighbors assigned to help with communications are invited to a communications workshop from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 2; the Zoom link here. Both sessions are free and will be held online.

The drill will take place on multiple blocks throughout Burlingame. Adults and children 10 years and older can take active roles. Participants can lead a drill on their own block if they have at least eight participants, or they can join another block's drill.
