**The Grave of Anson Burlingame.**

A chaste and neatly-chiseled sarcophagus has been placed upon the lot in Mount Auburn Cemetery, Cambridge, Mass., where lies buried the body of ANSON BURLINGAME. It consists of a massive granite plinth, succeeded by a marble base, which bears a second base neatly molded and beaded; the latter is surmounted with a die deeply paneled for inscriptions and ornaments. The front panel is of Gothic shape. The cap which succeeds is embellished with sprays of olive foliage, and fruit, and also with a beautiful cluster of palm-leaves. Front inscription, in old English letters, "ANSON BURLINGAME." Rear, "Born Nov. 14, 1820. Died Feb. 23, 1870."
