City News Note From The City Administrator



It is hard to believe the holiday season is upon us. The City Council continues to work through the budget process for Fiscal Year 2019. You can keep up to date on the budget process as well as the six-year (2019 to 2024) development of the capital facility, equipment replacement, and information technology plans wrap up here at: http://www.cpwa.us/departments/finance/budget_2019.php. Also, please keep in mind that the implementation of the Stormwater Utility begins on January 1st, 2019. The utility was created to fund new activities required by the State of Washington Department of Ecology demanding we obtain a NPDES Phase II permit beginning in 2019 for our Stormwater System. Customers can turn in an application to receive a Stormwater Utility fee credit of \$2.63 a month if an engineered stormwater system certified by a Washington licensed professional engineer serves their premises. The State of Washington Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) recently awarded the city a grant for \$1,682,500 to reconstruct C Street from College Avenue to Larch Avenue. The City received another grant from TIB to resurface Lamperti Lane and repair broken sidewalk panels from Larch Avenue to College Avenue in the amount of \$289,088. Both projects will take place sometime in Summer 2019. Pacific Power will be wrapping up switching out wooden pole sodium streetlights to LED's this month. Columbia REA will be following suit as well. Both of these projects are funded by a TIB Relight WA Grant. The City in partnership with Walla Walla University, Hayden Homes, JUB Engineers, and Pacific Power is once again putting on the Winterfest celebration the night of Thursday, December 6th, 2018. Activities will take place from 4 PM to 8:15 PM. The lighted parade


will occur on College Avenue from 10th Street to Whitman Drive at 5:30 PM. A community gathering with carols and Santa Claus will occur at the College Place Fire Department immediately following the parade. A tree lighting at City Hall will follow the event at the Fire Department. The fireworks show will occur at the Old Rogers School site (bounded by 4th Street, 6th Street, Bade Avenue, and Davis Avenue) at 8:15 PM.

City facilities will be closed in observance of the Christmas holiday from December 24th at noon resuming normal business hours on December 27th. Happy Holidays everyone!

XPRESS BILL PAY


The City of College Place utilizes Xpress Bill Pay as the processor for our electronic payments. Through their website and app you can look at your account balance, set up


