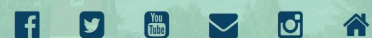
A Note From The City Administrator

Many things are happening in the City as we are getting closer to summer. We are a little over a month away from beginning work on the 4th & Academy Way project which is anticipated to take most of the summer. Our project team is working feverishly on engineering plans for the two replacement wells to our drinking water system. One well will be installed on some property adjacent to Christ Community Fellowship on Peppers Bridge Rd. Another will be installed on some property the city owns adjacent to water tanks on Maple Avenue. The City Council recently voted to turn the intersection of 12th & Larch into a four way stop-sign intersection. Stop signs facing both sides of 12th Street will have flashing lights similar to the signs at Gose & Wallula. Implementation will occur later this summer. The City is also partnering with United Way of Walla Walla, YMCA, YWCA, College Place Public Schools, and others to offer a Pilot Youth Recreation program this summer. Information on this program will be posted to the website and mailed out to residents shortly.

The City is partnering with ASWWU to have a Block Party on College Avenue between Fourth & Whitman on Sunday, May 20th from 4 to 7 PM. Please come out to this community event. The College Place Farmers Market is coming back as well. It will run on Thursdays from May 31st to September 27th from 4 to 7 PM in the City Hall parking lot (625 S. College Ave, CP). The City landed a grant from the Pacific Power Foundation to purchase an outdoor movie theater to show movies in the park this summer, so look for announcements on that as well.

WWU Men's Golf Team Places 3rd In Conference Championship

The Walla Walla University Wolves men's golf team placed third in the Cascade Collegiate Conference Championship tournament at Pronghorn Resort in Bend, Oregon, April 23–24.

The Wolves were in fifth place at the end of the first day of play on Pronghorn's Jack Nicklaus Signature Course. On Tuesday, WWU seniors Brendan Collins and Cole Henderson each put up scores of 78 in the final round to help move the Wolves into third place.

"We talked about focusing on one shot at a time, one hole at a time, and having a short memory after a bad swing or bad hole," said Rodd Strobel, Wolves golf coach. "It was a very challenging course. There was only one red number for the tournament."

"I told them to always do their best no matter how their round was going because you never know how the other teams are playing," said Strobel. That approach would prove key to the team's success in the third round. The Wolves were one of only two teams to improve scores between the second and third rounds and the only team to improve in each round of the tournament.

The team from Oregon Institute of Technology took first place with a tournament score of 930, with Corban University placing second at 952. The Wolves posted a final tournament score of 981. Mayson Tibbs from Oregon Tech was the individual event champion with a combined score of 225. Tibbs was the only player to shoot below par in the tournament. Other universities at the tournament were College of Idaho, Multnomah University, Northwest Christian University, and Warner Pacific University.

Wolves golf team members participating in the tournament were: Aubrey Fautheree, senior; Brendan Collins, senior; Cole Henderson, senior; Jarrett Johnson, senior; and Kevin Cummings, sophomore.

Henderson said the key to the final round for him was his mental approach. "Especially with this course, everyone had to grind through the big numbers. Being able to avoid those big numbers or being able to mentally check back in after those big numbers was huge. This course had a lot more trouble than any other course that we have played." Henderson said that controlling the damage was the difference maker. "I still found myself off in the sagebrush a few times, but I minimized the damage a lot by not turning one mistake into two."

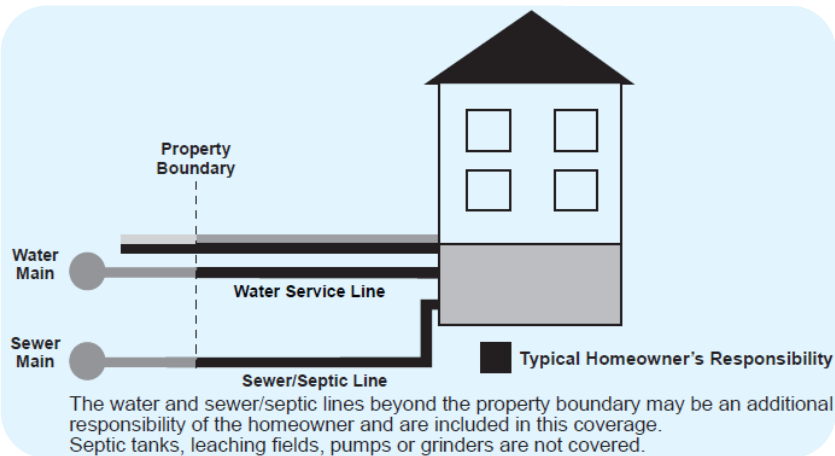
Collins said, "During the first two rounds I had a couple of bad holes, and [Tuesday] I eliminated those. I knew it was going to be an okay round [Tuesday] after I birdied two of my first three holes."

"We passed two teams that went backward [Tuesday], even though every one of my boys felt like they could have played better. I have never been more proud of these guys. Not because of the third place, which is a really big deal for us, but because of the way they stayed focused and resilient on a very difficult course."

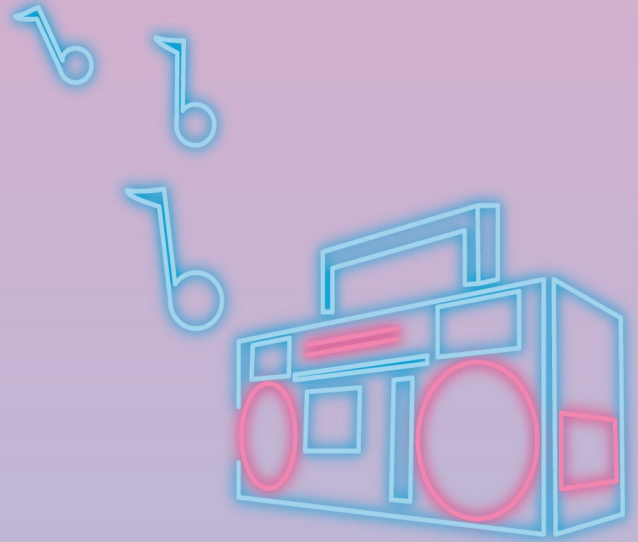
