## WWU students develop new exhibit for Fort Walla Walla Museum

Design students from Walla Walla University partnered with Fort Walla Walla Museum during spring quarter to create a new museum exhibit. Over the course of the quarter the students drew up designs to better display tools and artifacts that were stored at the museum. They also created cost estimates for implementing the project and then pitched their ideas to the museum's collections manager, Shannon Buchal.

"When I gave them the project, I basically just took them into the space and asked them how they felt about it and what they thought needed to change," said Buchal. "Then I directed them to the cases with the tools. I asked them to help turn it into an exhibit that would be informative and teach people who didn't know quite as much about the tools and the industries to which they belonged." The results were beyond anything the museum expected.

The new exhibit incorporates a clean, finished look with warm, rustic qualities. A double-sided wall focuses the viewer on a few particular tools, and signs identify and describe them. Tools of various trades are featured in four sections labeled woodwork, livestock, leatherwork, and industrial.

One part of the new exhibit features a built-in display that allows young children to peek in at an array of metal tools. On the wall are two interactive elements that invite children to solve visual puzzles. The design team also incorporated a new wooden viewing platform into the Jo-So Sheep Wagon for shorter visitors.

"I think that it looks like a whole new building," said Buchal. "They were able to breathe new life into the space and make it something fun and informative that all ages can enjoy."

## A Note From The City Administrator

I hope everyone is having a great summer. Lots of projects are currently underway. Pro-Meters Incorporated is in the middle of switching out water meters from a manual to a radio read water meter. Additional information is located here: <a href="http://www.cpwa.us/news\_detail\_T30\_R193.php">http://www.cpwa.us/news\_detail\_T30\_R193.php</a>. The C Street reconstruction is in progress. Culbert Construction is working on installing new wastewater and storm mains. Next, will be the new water mains and then road/sidewalk work. C Street from College to Damson should be fully reconstructed by the end of September. Then Culbert will move to C Street between Damson and Larch. The goal is to have the project wrapped up by the end of the year.

The City continues to work on the two replacement wells for our municipal drinking water system. Drilling Well #1 adjacent to Christ Community Fellowship on Peppers Bridge Rd has wrapped up at a depth of 838 feet. Next, a pump test will need to be conducted to measure the standard water flows from the well site followed by the construction of a well house as well as a procurement of a pump, motor, and electrical generator equipment. This replacement well is planned to be fully operational by next summer. Tapani is constructing a looped water line to connect the well to the City water system via Larch and McMinn/College Avenue. That construction is slated to wrap up this Fall. The City received several grants and legislative appropriations for this work since it also connects Liberty Christian School to the municipal water system which was needed since their water supply had high nitrates.

Schneider drilling is starting to drill replacement Well #2 on city-owned property located on Maple Ave near Whitman Drive. It is estimated that this Well will be fully operational by the end of 2020. Hayden Homes is slated to begin construction of a public park within the Homestead development at the foot of the bluff between Doans and Homestead Avenues just south of Fourth Street. The park development work should wrap up in September.

Please take part in the various community activities slated for August. August 6<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 to 7:30 PM is National Night Out at Pioneer Park in Walla Walla. The College Place Farmers Market is every Thursday from 4 to 8 PM at Lions Park located at SE 8<sup>th</sup> & Larch. The event features many vendors and live musical entertainment. August 22<sup>nd</sup> will be the last Movies at the Park at Lions Park immediately following Farmers Market featuring the movie Mr. Poppers Penguins.

Finally, thanks to everyone, the College Place Lions Club, and all other volunteers that participated in the Garrison Creek Cleanup Day on July 21<sup>st</sup>. A lot of trash and debris was removed from the Garrison Creek corridor. We plan to turn this event into an annual activity, so stay tuned.


