Current Superintendent Tim Payne announced his planned resignation earlier this month and it will be effective on June 30, 2019.

During his tenure, Superintendent Payne was integral in building the vision and mission for College Place Public Schools. Under his leadership, CPPS doubled student enrollment and staff hires. He was instrumental in passing the bond to build College Place's first high school, rebuild Davis Elementary School and remodel Sager Middle School.

College Place School Board Chairman Brian Maiden said, "We would like to thank Mr. Payne for his tireless work and commitment to make school different, for his innovative work with the board to build the vision and mission for the kids of College Place, and for always putting people first. He will be greatly missed in our district and our community."

The search process to find a successor for Superintendent Payne is officially underway and an announcement will be made in early May as to who will succeed Mr. Payne.

The new superintendent will begin on July 1, 2019.
