Message From The Mayor

Here at City Hall, your Mayor, City Administrator, City Council, and all the staff are working hard to keep our community safe and informed, therefore this is being sent out to explain the role of the City in this COVID-19 Coronavirus Pandemic and provide general information. In Public Health situations across Walla Walla County, the County Community Health Department is the lead agency. The City follows the directives of the County Health Department. The agency has a phone line dedicated to COVID-19 questions that can be reached at 509-524-2647. Among the primary prevention activities are such measures as:

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Use hand sanitizer.

Avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid contact with sick people.

Stay home if you are sick.

Cover mouth/nose with a tissue or sleeve when coughing or sneezing.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

Exercise social distancing.

The College Place City Council adopted Resolution #20-009 on March 17th, 2020 which is an Emergency Disaster Declaration for the COVID-19 Pandemic. This Resolution allows the City access to State and Federal resources to fight the COVID-19 Pandemic. It allows the City to enter into contracts with City Council approval without a lengthy bidding process. It also allows the city to waive late fees and utility shutoffs for individuals that are impacted by the COVID-19 virus for the months of March and April.

It allows the City Administrator to close city facilities as is reasonable to protect the health of the public and the employees of the City. As such, public access to the City Hall, Police Department, and Fire Department has ceased. However, city services can still be accessed by calling the main City phone number at 509-529-1200, call or email specific City staffers using this directory: http://www.cpwa.us/staff directory/index.php, or calling 911 for emergencies. Bills can be paid either via phone or through XpressBillPay at www.xpressbillpay.com, and as always the drop boxes are being checked daily. Police and Fire are responding to calls as they always do. If calling 911,

please alert the operator if you have potential symptoms of Coronavirus like fever, cough, or shortness of breath, so first responders can put on additional protective equipment. The Resolution also suspended Advisory Board and Commission meetings until either the Governor or Mayor indicate the Emergency is over. City Council meetings will be held via video conference.

Comments received by the Clerk no later than 5:00 PM on the meeting date will be added to the public comment section of the meeting for Council and the public to review. Comments will not be read aloud.

The emergency declaration also allows the Mayor to issue Executive Orders to acts in the business community which endangers public health and safety such as measures to prevent anti-hoarding and price gouging. We ask residents to support our local business community in this trying time. Order take-out food, a gift card, or order goods through their website.
