Note From The City Administrator

Happy holiday season everyone! While we cannot host our annual Winterfest in its traditional format due to COVID-19, we have some alternatives. We were able to acquire various decorations to liven up the College Avenue corridor thanks to our sponsors: Columbia REA, Walla Walla Valley Honda, Baker Boyer Bank, Pacific Power, and Community Bank. We will also be participating in the Parade of Lights competition and driving tour that was created by the Downtown Walla Walla Foundation, Nelson Construction, and others. We look forward to seeing all the decorations from a distance and the continued community support.

December 24th also marks the 75th anniversary of the City's incorporation. Mike Denny, with the support of the Historic Preservation Commission, is writing a book to commemorate this occasion. We will let the community know when this work is available. Also in December, the budget and associated six-year plans (capital facilities, equipment replacement, and information technology) are passed by City Council. While the 2021 Fiscal Year budget proposal is definitely tight due to the economic uncertainties we all face, the City is still able to provide core services and move forward with capital projects thanks to aggressively pursuing grants and partnerships. A flier will be included with the January 2021 newsletter that will illustrate all of the key takeaways of the final adopted budget.

Several innovative projects are underway thanks to great partnerships. Through a generous sponsorship from P1FCU the City will unveil traffic box art wraps at eight utility boxes throughout the College Avenue corridor by the end of the first quarter next year. Another exciting partnership to take place is with Adventist Health. The Walla Walla Valley region was chosen as the community for the Blue Zone work to take place in and Adventist Health purchased the Blue Zone project.
