Note From The City Administrator

Walla Walla County is still under Phase II of Governor Inslee's Safe Start Plan. In October, some guidance changed on activities including libraries being allowed to reopen at 25% capacity in Phase II. The College Place Branch of the Walla Walla Rural Library is working on reopening. The College Place Library Branch can be reached at (509)-540-3418 or at chessa@wwrurallibrary.com. City facilities are still closed to the public due to the Phase II guidance. Fall means many things in College Place. Wrapping up construction projects and positioning the City for new ones in FY 2021. The City substantially completed reconstruction of Southeast 10th Street from Birch to College Avenues. The roadway consists of new pavement, curb and gutter, and stormwater infrastructure. The new *Robert Gordon* Well #4 Peppers Bridge Rd well is now fully complete and hooked up to the city's water system. The Well was recently dedicated in honor of City Engineer Robert Gordon who unexpectedly passed away in late August. The City is going to wrap up a wastewater sewer lining project in the alleys of the Scenic View and Mountain View by late November. The Sherwood Trust Leadership Group Class of 2020 is shortly going to construct a Parklet with donated labor, fundraised dollars, and such on a piece of property located just west of SE

12th/Newgate on land formerly owned by Cascade Natural Gas that is now owned by the City.

The leaves are starting to fall. If you bag or box leaves, leave them 2" away from your garbage can and Basin Disposal will collect them when they collect garbage at no charge. If you rake leaves to the street, city crews will be going around town with the sweeper and loader and dump truck to collect them. Leave pickup will not be scheduled. The City will collect leaves as they see the need and have the time. For more information, please contact Public Works Director Paul Hartwig.

The City is also starting the process of getting ready to bid out construction projects for early next year. This includes resurfacing Meadowbrook Blvd (grant-funded), constructing sidewalks along Bade, Davis, and SW 12th (grant-funded), the Southwest Sewer Wastewater Trunk Line (partially-grant funded), Well house at Drinking Water Well #6 (Whitman/Maple) (partially-grant funded). The City is also well into our Fiscal Year 2021 Budgeting process. Exciting news: in the next few weeks the College Place Library will be able to open its doors to limited in-person visits! We are busy getting the branch ready for you, getting our permits and safety checks in order, so please be patient with us!

Please note that <u>Curbside Pickup is still intended to be the mainstay of the library's service at this time</u>. If you have questions about how Curbside Pickup works, give us a call and we'll walk you through it. It's like restaurant take-out – but for library materials!

While we are very excited to see you, here are some things to keep in mind when considering your visit.

- You must call to schedule an appointment: Appointments are 20 minutes long with a set beginning and ending time. We cannot extend this time. Please give us a call at 509-540-3418 to talk to a staff person about scheduling your appointment.
- Appointments are limited: We are only allowing one family group of up to 5 people total to visit at one time. This is for your safety and the safety of our staff.
- Masks and physical distancing are REQUIRED for all: For your safety, the safety of your fellow patrons, and that of our employees, you *must* wear a mask that *fully covers your nose and mouth* and maintain physical distancing of at least six feet from other persons while at the library. If you are unable to wear a mask, our staff will make every effort to serve you via Curbside Pickup or by helping you access our online resources.
- <u>Computer assistance is not available</u>: Because of physical distancing restraints, library staff will be unable to provide computer support for patrons who may need it.
- <u>Safety is our highest priority:</u> Staff will be disinfecting materials and surfaces between appointments. Because of this, we will not have toys, coloring sheets, or activities out for children.
