Public Works has a number of projects underway. The Stormwater Utility is currently reconstructing SE 10th Street between SE Birch and SE College to include appropriate curb & gutter, stormwater inlets, and a new street surface. The Wastewater Utility is undertaking sewer lining projects to improve the integrity of the mains around the Scenic View/ Mountain View Hill areas. The Water Utility recently finished the Well-house construction

at the new Well #4/Peppers Bridge Well near Liberty Christian School. Projects on the near horizon is construction of the Southwest Wastewater/Lift Station Trunk Line which will add needed capacity to the wastewater system south of 12th Street. Also, the City will be requesting contractor bids shortly for the Community Development Block Grant funded sidewalk construction project along the following roadway segments: SW 12th Street (College to Bade), SW Bade (10th to 7th), SW Bade (5th to 6th), and SW Davis (Whitman to 3rd). The City is also into our Fiscal Year 2021 Budgeting process. "Our Community is Counting on Us"

This has definitely been an unprecedented to the 2020 school year in College Place Public Schools. I know that the challenges of this pandemic have had impacts that are far reaching in each of our homes and our community; it has been no different in our schools. As we began to plan, strategize and try to figure out how to tackle this task, the CPPS Board of Directors and leadership had five guiding principles with one of them being "Our community is counting on us."

We do not take our lightly the role that we play in our community and in each of the homes of our students. We realize that each decision that we make affects the lives of those in our community and we are working to ensure to act with caution, with empathy, and compassion. We value our partnership with the College Place community and know we will come out on the other side of this stronger than ever before.

It is with a sense of true amazement that I brag about the great work of our staff to transition our traditional inperson brick and mortar schools into the world of virtual learning. In a period of six months, our staff have astounded with their ability to find ways to teach students ages 5-21 over the internet. We have distributed nearly 1500 devices so that all of our students can connect and have added community hot spots at Davis Elementary (upper parking lot), CPHS (stadium parking lot), and Valle Lindo to support access for families. The transformation to remote, virtual and the quality of teaching and learning that goes on daily is incredible.

Even as we continue to work in a remote setting, we are working towards our return to in-person, onsite learning in a hybrid model very soon. The CPPS Board of Directors voted to move towards this return on or after October 18 depending on local health conditions and other factors needing consideration. College Place Public Schools has selected an AM/PM model where students will learn in-person for half of the day and will work on directed instruction online at home for the other half of the day. This type of model allows us to maintain our social distancing, mask wearing, hand washing, and health screening requirements. While we cannot wait to be back 100% in-person for full day instruction, this will have to do until then.

We know that College Place is counting on us and we will continue to do unprecedented work in these unprecedented times. Thank you again to the many who are collaborating with us to make the best of these difficult circumstances. We appreciate the patience and understanding, and the support you give to College Place Public Schools.

Make sure the pick up location is set to College Place. Of course, we are always happy to help folks find materials and place holds over the phone, so don't hesitate to give us a call.
