Message From The Mayor

Hello Neighbors,

Can it really be September already? How time flies faster and faster every year. It is time to start preparing the fall plantings for our gardens. My summer garden was not very successful this year, a few tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, and yellow squash made it to my table, but not very many. I failed to properly prune the tomatoes and peppers early on in the season and ended up with leggy and fruitless plants. The watermelon, peas, and cilantro I planted sadly never made it out of the dirt. I am concluding it was a water issue, as in I did not give them enough. Sometimes it is difficult to balance being conscious of how precious water is here in the Valley and knowing how much to give my garden. Next year I will be wiser and better prepared and hope to share my bounty with you then.

I celebrated my one-year anniversary of being your mayor last month and what an honor it has been. I planted a tree with the students at Davis Elementary for Arbor Day in Kiwanis Park, I dedicated Veteran's Park, our city's first new park in over forty years in the Homestead neighborhood, and I shared my advice for perseverance with our students at College Place High School (go Hawks!). Wondering How To Submit a Public Comment During COVID-19?

When submitting public comments, they should include the following regardless of the manner you are using:

- Your Name
- Your Address

Public comments may be provided in one of three ways:

- Comments in writing of no more than 1 page (If typed, no less than 11 pt. font) may be submitted <u>no later</u> than 4:30 PM on the meeting date to be included in the report.
- Comments may be made by telephone during the meeting by calling a number that will be provided to you
 upon notification to the City Clerk no later than 4:30 PM the day of the meeting. *
- Comments may be made by virtual meeting attendance with a link that will be provided to your email upon notification to the City Clerk no later than 4:30 PM the date of the meeting. *
 - * If you would like to make a public comment by either phone or virtual meeting, you can contact the Clerk at Ineissl@cpwa.us no later than 4:30 PM on the meeting date.
