Hard to believe summer is almost here. As such, there are things to look forward to. The 5th season of the College Place Farmers & Artisans Market begins on Thursday, May 27th. It will go every Thursday through the end of September from 4 to 7 PM at Lions Park (801 SE Larch). The City is once again partnering with United Way of the Blue Mountains and Campfire to offer a Summer Camp at Kiwanis Park. The City plans on reopening the lobbies of city facilities to limited walk in traffic on Monday, May 3rd at 8 AM. Please follow the posted COVID-19 protocols. The lobbies at that point will remain open unless the Walla Walla County declines to Phase Two or regulations from the State change. A lot of City projects are active at the moment:

- <u>Southwest Wastewater Trunk Line</u>: The base of the lift station has been poured. The contractor is starting to lay pipe and is awaiting delivery of manhole construction materials. - <u>SE Meadowbrook Blvd Resurfacing</u>: This state grant funded project is complete thanks to the expeditious work of Central Washington Asphalt.
- <u>NW Destito Stormwater Work</u>: New piping has been installed. The contractor is in the process
 of installing the stormwater filtration equipment mandated by the State. This project should

- <u>Central College Place Sidewalks</u>: This State CDBG grant funded project which involves building sidewalks along SW Davis, SW Bade, and SW 12th will be awarded by Council to the contractor at the April 27th meeting. 


Enactus Community Garden
