## A Message From The Mayor

I know it's been a while since you've last heard from me. But I'm sure you will understand that sometimes there are just not enough hours in the day, and before you know it, the day is done. However, I've had great fortune to see some of you while in the community. I've also had the pleasure of having some wonderful conversations with many of you over the summer and fall months. However, as the year ends, I find myself with time forced upon me due to an injured shoulder.

Over the past months, I have had the honor of planting a tree with Davis Elementary students at Kiwanis Park, speaking at Walla Walla University's Fall Community Day, being invited to join a table at Sonbridge's Annual Luncheon, seeing thousands of you at College Place's Trunk or Treat event, and attending the grand opening of new businesses to our wonderful community, Chipotle and Enable Art. We also welcomed our newest police officer, remodeled City Council chambers, and updated the city's website to make navigating easier. We also have several infrastructure projects happening over the next few months. These include water wells, reservoirs, storm drains, safer engineering of roads, adding more sidewalks, and our wastewater treatment plant upgrade. Unfortunately, we did not see the expected ground at Lions Park. We had scheduled the groundbreaking for summertime; however, we ran into some permitting issues with the state, which significantly pushed us back. Without permits, we couldn't even put the project up for bid. But the good news is things have progressed, and we are ready to invite businesses to submit a proposal to help us build Lions Park for future generations. The result will be amazing; I can't wait to share it with you! Construction and renovations will likely go through summer and most, if not all, of fall 2024.

This means the 2024 Farmers and Artisans' Market will be at Kiwanis Park. The public works team is currently working on getting the park all set up in preparation. Many of you expressed concerns about the Farmers Market at the Municipal Campus parking lot. It took a few weeks for us to figure it out and be situated, but rest assured, we heard you and moved it back to Lions Park as quickly as possible since the expected renovations were not happening. I'd like to thank all who messaged me with your concern for our community members' and vendors' health and safety; it was heartwarming.

With winter here, it is time for us to remember to be considerate of one another. Please clean leaves from the storm drain grates to prevent flooding, keep snow and ice clear from walkways, and drive more carefully when the road conditions are unsafe. In case of ice and snow on the roads, the public works crews will clear roads in the early mornings.

As always, they begin with the most traveled roads (I.e., College Ave, Larch, Rose, C Street, Lamperti, and Meadowbrook) and then move on to high-traffic neighborhood roads. They try to clear the rest of the city-managed roads if weather conditions allow. However, sometimes, by the time they finish the high-traffic neighborhood roads, they need to go back and re-clear the high-traffic roads. For those living in HOA-managed communities, I encourage you to check with your HOA board about your community's snow and ice policies for your streets.

If you do not yet follow the city's social media pages (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and the Nextdoor app), I highly encourage you to do so, as the city staff regularly share videos with vital information on projects throughout the city. We do our best to communicate and prevent you from being caught off guard as much as possible.

In closing, I invite you all to join me at the College Place Winterfest and Lighted Parade on Thursday, December 7th, on College Ave. between 4th St. And 10th St. This year, we will kick off the season with a bazaar and Santa meet and greet beginning at 4:00 PM. The tree lighting will happen at 5:30 PM in front of the municipal campus, and the parade will begin at 6:00 PM. We will close the evening at 7:15 with a fireworks show (please secure your pets). Be sure to stop by and say hello to me; that is always the best part of the evening for me. Warmest regards,

#### EMAIL

In order to sign up online, you must have a personal email. Come prepared with your email and password to verify your new utility account.

#### UTILITY BILL



Bring a copy of your most recent utility bill. Account numbers have changed from the old system. You will need your new account number and your last payment amount.

#### COMPUTER

The College Place Library has three computers that are **FREE** to use! They're secure and there are instructions to set up your account at the Library!



What if I don't have my account number or last payment amount?

Your account number is located on the top right hand corner of your new utility bill. If you don't have your current bill, call City Hall to get that information.
