A Note From The City Administrator

Spring is right around the corner. As such, we are starting work on very important park projects. The City finally got all the Federal and State permits to work on Lions Park and Nelson Construction will be working on the park rehabilitation project all year. Most of the park will be off limits. The park is expected to be reopened in Spring 2025, just in time for Farmers Market! Information will be posted here: <u>www.cpwa.us/residents/lions_park_renovation.php</u> Additionally, the City just received a State Transportation Improvement Board grant to construct a sidewalk on one side of SE 8th where gaps exist from College to Larch Avenue including curb bulb outs and a rapid flashing beacon to safely cross Larch Avenue at 8th street. This project will be in engineering throughout 2024 with a 2025 construction date.

The City is also currently working on getting electrical systems installed at Kiwanis Park around the gazebo and the central-northern section of the park. This will allow the park to support community events that are relocating to this park during the Lions Park construction such as the Farmers Market and Movies at the Park. Kiwanis Park will be home to the Spring Fling event May 10th-12th. This event is put on by Liz & Gary Pierce.

This spring, the City will have the crosswalk in front of the Post Office on College Avenue under construction. This is paid for by a State Department of Transportation Pedestrian Safety Grant. This project will include bulb outs, better lighting, and additional safety enhancements.

Additionally, expect NE Damson (Cargill to Rose) to be under construction soon. This section of roadway will match the cross section of the other portion to the south to include sidewalks and curb/gutter. This is also paid for by a State Transportation Improvement Board Grant. As part of this project lane striping on NE Rose from Lambert to Carey Ct will be adjusted to match the City of Walla Walla's new treatment that will be installed (two lanes, with center turn lane, and bike lanes).

Also, the City continues to explore bringing back the recycling program.
