Spring and home improvement weather are upon us, please be reminded that as of March 15, 2024, the following codes with Washington State Amendments, have been adopted by the City and are now being enforced:

- 2021 International Building Code
- 2021 International Residential Code
- 2021 International Mechanical Code
- 2021 International Fire Code
- 2021 Washington State Energy Code
- 2021 Uniform Plumbing Code

Permits are required for new construction, additions and remodels. Building permits are also required for replacing windows, doors, siding, roofing systems, fences, water heaters and HVAC equipment.

There is a simple reason why building permits are required for construction—it's all about safety. Building codes help ensure that the structures in which we live, work and play meet the standards against collapse, fire and other potential dangers. If structures are not up to code, insurance companies may not pay on damage claims, and property owners could be liable if someone is injured. If you have any question as to your project requiring a permit, please contact me.
