## **A Message From The Mayor**



It's going to be a busy summer. We recently signed the contract to completely rebuild C Street. Expect the work to begin within the next 30 days and last through the summer and fall. Stay tuned as we work with the contractor to establish the schedule for construction. The new well #4 going in on Peppers Bridge is at 750 feet this week, we expect it to be on line early next year. You're going to be given an opportunity to vote for inclusion in the Rural Library District on August 6<sup>th</sup>. We'll be sending you some additional information in your July Utility Bill and posted online on our website and Facebook page.

As the summer approaches here are a few tips on water conservation. We'll be posting a full list on the website.

- Monitor your water bill for unusually high use; your bill and water meter are tools that can help you discover leaks.
- Read your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used; if the meter does not read exactly the same, there is a leak.
- Fix those leaky pipes and faucets
  - A faucet dripping one drop per second can waste up to 2,700 gallons/year.
- Install water conserving appliances.
- Upgrade and insulate your water heater.
- Install water-saving aerators on all of your faucets.
- Never put water down the drain when there may be another use for it such as watering a plant or garden, or cleaning.

Mr. Fry currently serves as the Assistant Superintendent of Clarkston School District, where he began serving as the Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Executive Director in January 2012. Mr. Fry, his wife Angie and their four boys, Devin 18, Davis 15, James 10 and Brandon 8 will all be moving to College Place this summer.
