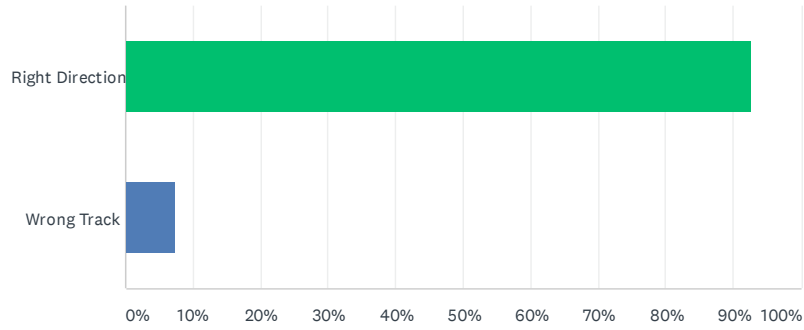


Q1 Do you feel things in College Place are generally going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten off on the wrong track?

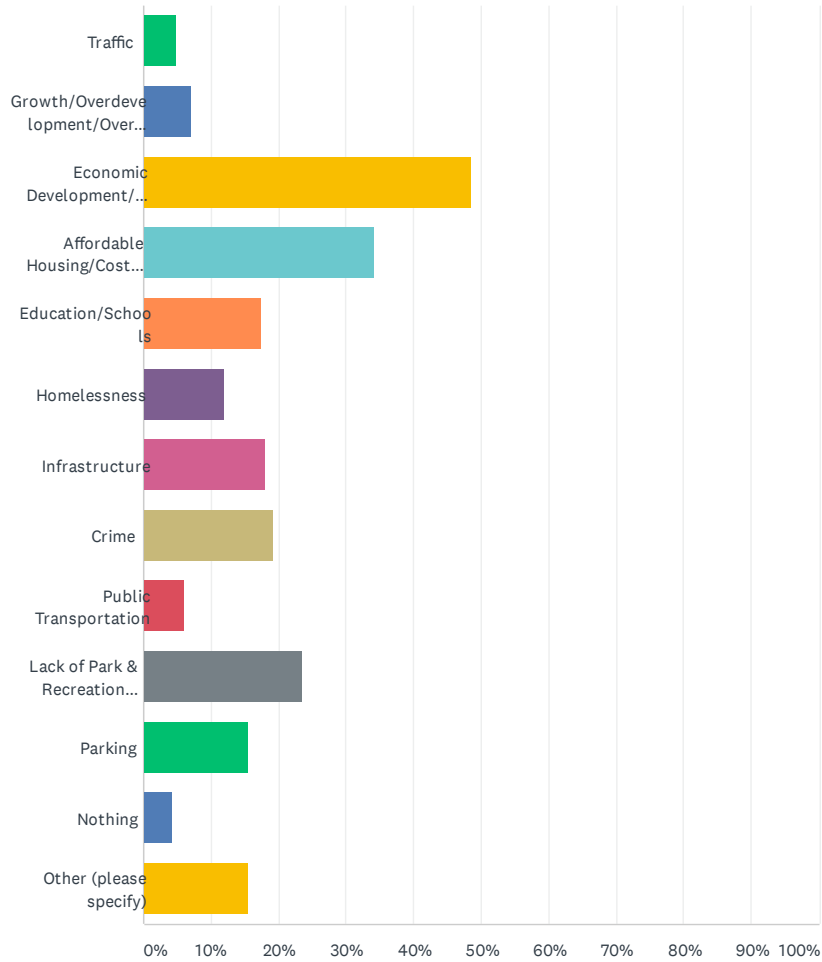

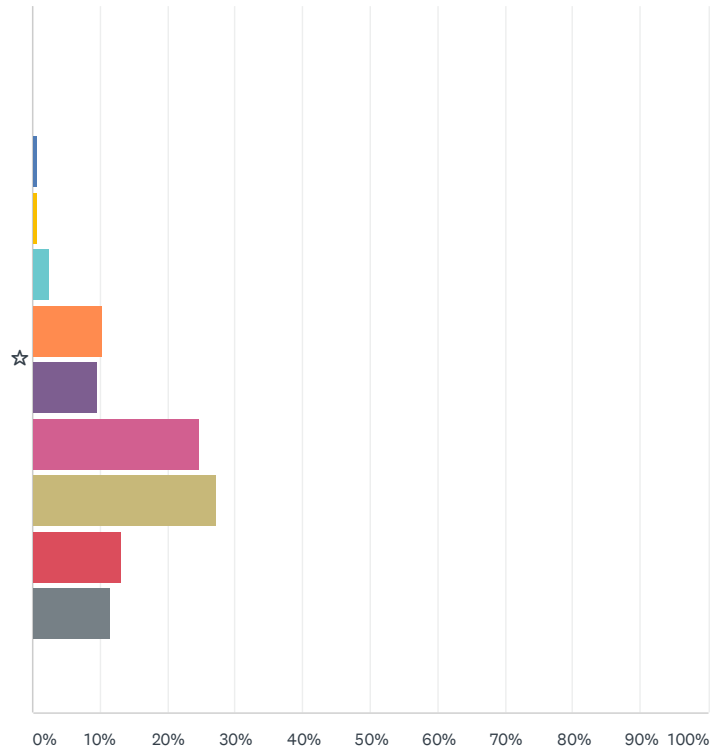

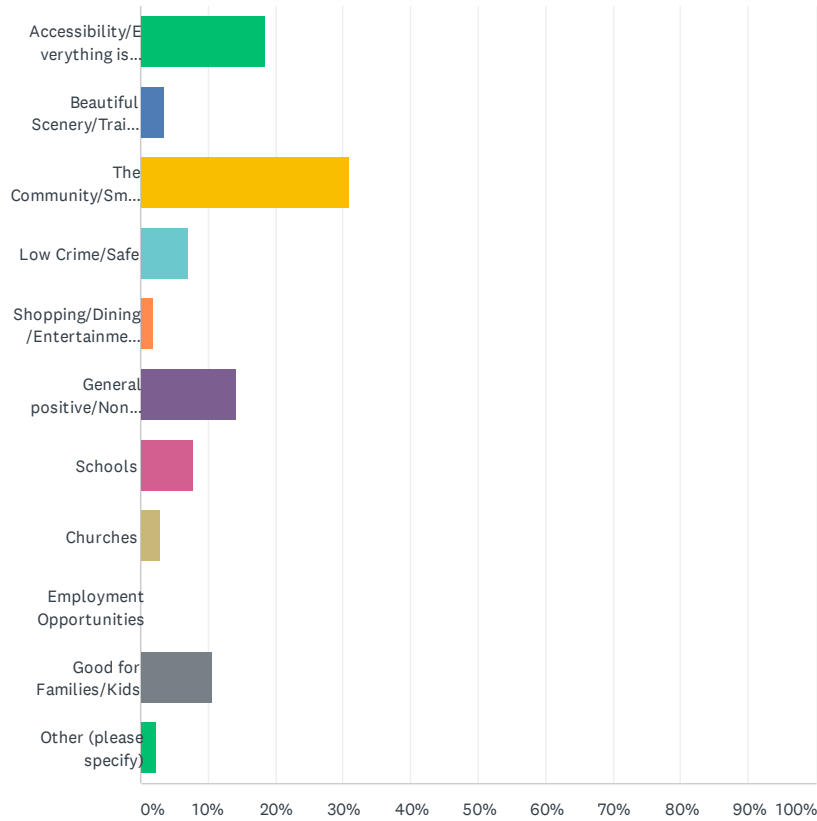

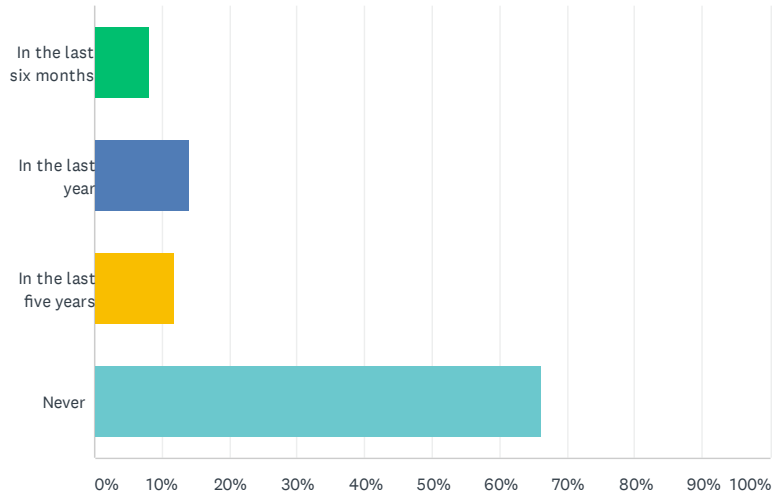

Q19 Have you attended a City Council or Advisory Commission/Board Meeting?

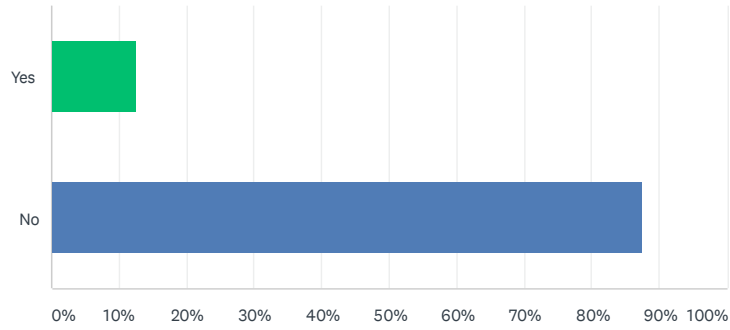

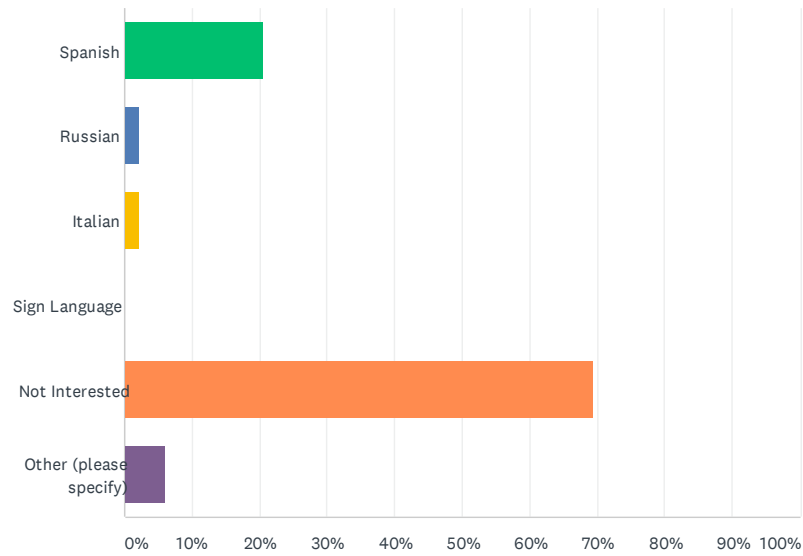

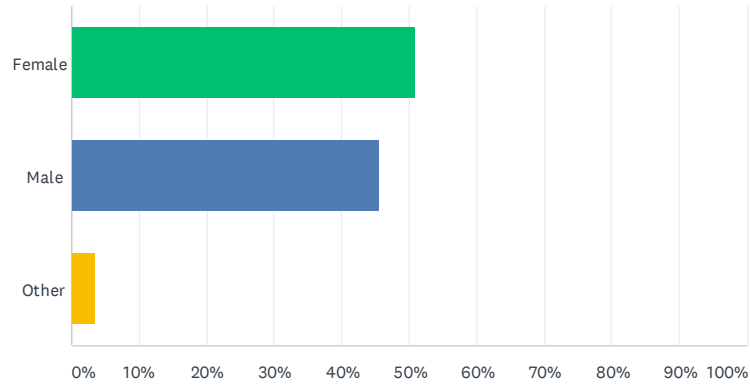

Q33 What is your gender?

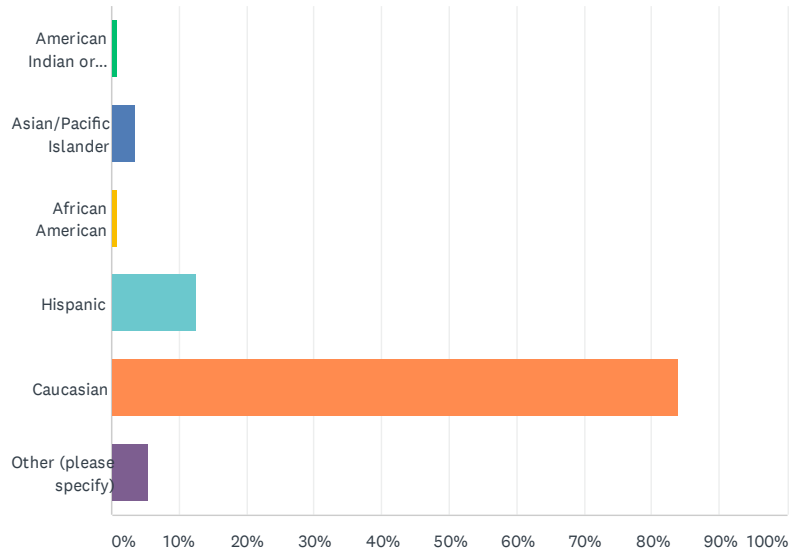

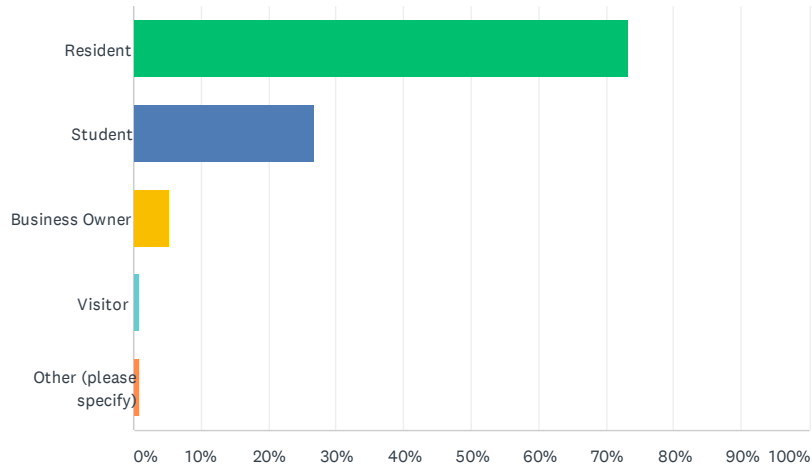

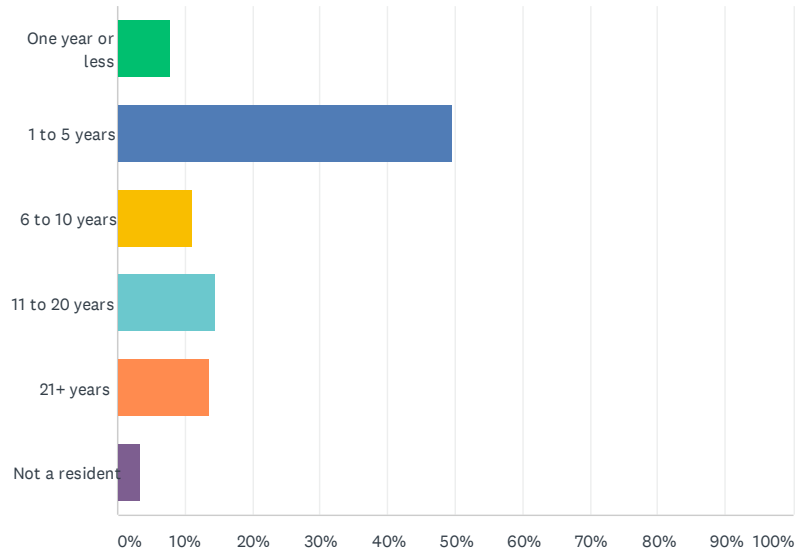

Q36 Length of Residency in the City?

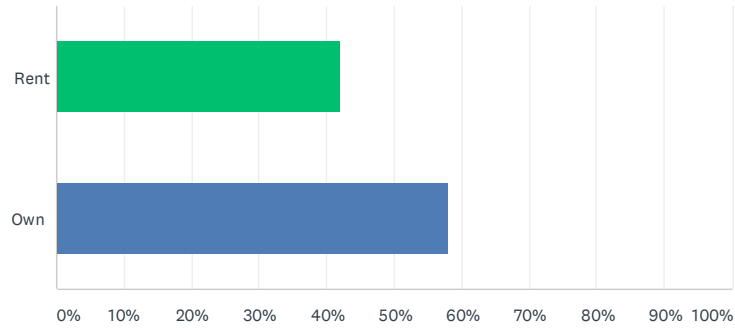

Q37 Do you rent or own your place of residence?

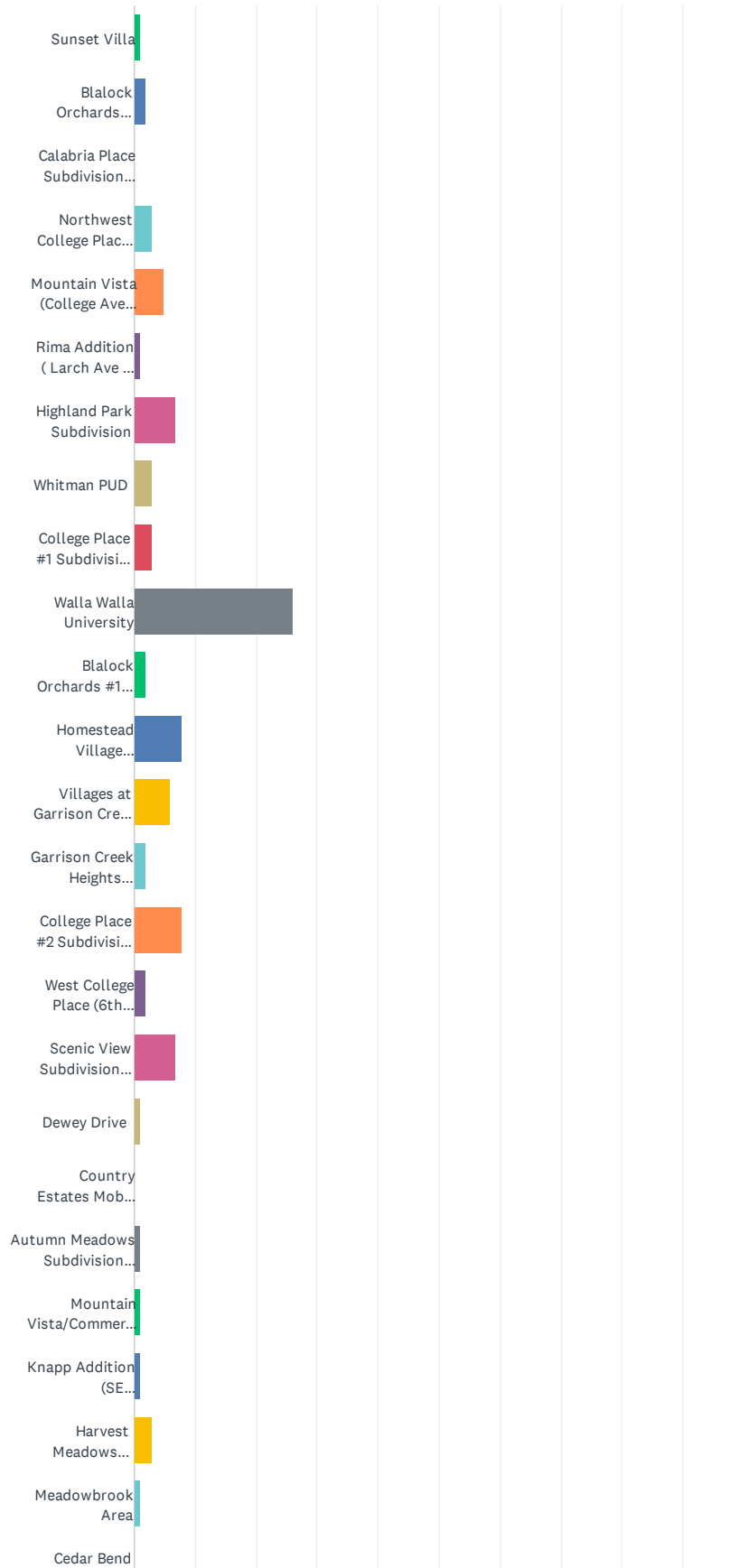

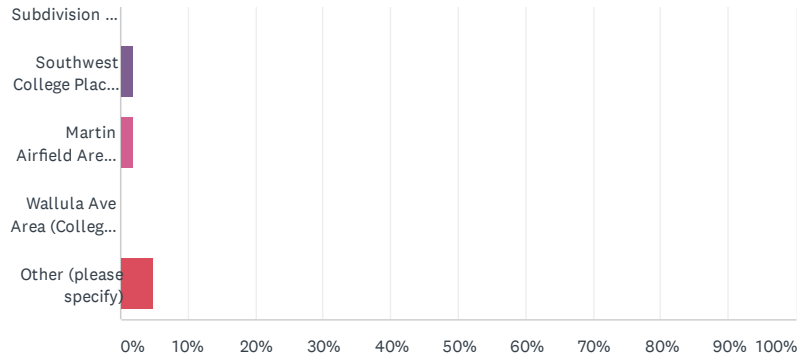
