(i) Maple Avenue between Washington Avenue and the driveway of Washington Arms.

B.) **Chapter 293, Section 61 Schedule XII** “Parking Prohibited at all Times” shall be amended to add the following streets: Maple Avenue between Washington Avenue and the driveway of Washington Arms.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 141 OF THE BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Collingswood that the Development Regulations are hereby amended as follow:

I. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 141; Development Regulations of the Borough Code. The Borough has determined that amending the Chapter is in the best interest of the Borough’s residents.

II. AMENDMENTS.

1. Section 141- 93.C (11)

Shall be changed to:

Floodlights, spotlights, and directed lights as part of a business ornamentation or sign illumination system that are not hooded or shielded so that the light source is not visible from any public right-of-way or adjacent property.

2. Section 141- 93.C (12)

Shall be changed to:

Unless otherwise exempted by 141-93(B)(1)(b), exposed neon and other exposed charged gas tube lighting fixtures, as well as other types of lighting fixtures used to simulate them, which are used for business identification signage, accessory signage, or ornamentation, may be used by businesses in the historic district with a certificate of appropriateness by the Historic Preservation Commission.

Commissioner Lewandowski, talked about an event being hosted by the Collingswood High School along with Camden County and our Municipal Alliance called Vaping me Crazy, Commissioner Lewandowski talked about the social health crisis of vaping affecting students. Commissioner Lewandowski talked about recycling information including the Recycling Coach App, the problems of dirty recycling and the increased costs of recycling around the country. Commissioner Lewandowski said the Roadway projects have been put on hold due to the weather.

Commissioner Leonard, also talked about recycling and the problems of plastic bags in our community. Commissioner Leonard invited residents to the Collingswood Community Chorus holiday concert. Commissioner Leonard also said she wanted to share some inspirational thoughts, she commented on something she heard in church and how it relates to the lighting of the town menorah and remembering Barbara Matousch. The words she heard were *it is better to light one candle in the darkness than to complain about the darkness*. Commissioner Leonard said how much these words remind her of Barbara Matousch, explaining Mrs. Matousch could light up a room with her presence, her helpfulness, and her joy. Commissioner Leonard thanked all the people who help bring light to our town by giving back. Commissioner Leonard wished for peace on earth and for everyone to have a Happy Hanukkah and Merry Christmas.

Mayor Maley thanked the parade committee specifically Jerry Chambers for another great Holiday Parade. Mayor Maley said many of the committee members have been volunteering for many years and they are in need of some new members. Mayor Maley thanked the Borough staff for the great work they do all year long. Mayor Maley explained along with Barbara Matousch's sudden passing the Borough Hall has had a few staff members out due to medical issues.

Commissioner Lewandowski reminded residents about the upcoming Town Forum on Wed Dec. 5 for the Public Safety Building .

Mayor Maley added that they are continuing to work with PATCO on the elevated noise level on the portion of Train track at Collings Ave.

Mayor Maley opened the meeting to the Public:

Suzanne Cloud, 241 Haddon Ave., asked if the Community Center would be ready for the Jazz series. Mr. Hastings replied it would. Ms. Cloud asked if there were details on Air B&B ordinance specific to the number of days a person could host guests in the. Mayor Maley explained the Borough attorney is still working on the draft and it would be submit it to the Commissioners for review when he is done. Ms. Cloud requested the regulations not be too limiting because she is trying to pay her taxes and mortgage and limits may not make it worth it.

Eleanor Kuzma, 947 Park Avenue expressed her support for Air B&B.

Kate Delany 126 Palmer Avenue, asked why the Borough Commissioners do not have a working session. Mayor Maley explained historically it has never been done. Ms. Delaney asked how residents can ask to have an item put on the agenda. Mayor Maley responded that a request can be sent to him and the other Commissioners

Susan Depper 317 Lees Avenue, reported problems with leaves in the street on the 300 block of Lees Ave. The Commissioners said it would look into.

John Kuzma 947 Park Ave. commented on the leaf concerns. Mr. Kuzma explained he puts out cones on leaf day so no one parks and blocks the leaf trucks. Mr. Kuzma asked for signs to be posted on leaf day to keep the path clear for the leaf trucks.

Ann Woodcock 121 E Palmer Avenue, asked when the last leaf pick up would be. Chief Carey said weather depending, it would be the last week of December.

Jen Rossi 114 Palmer Ave., expressed support of Air B&B

Richard Klingerman 743 Maple Terrace asked why local residents are not the Grand Marshalls of the Holiday Parade. Mayor Maley responded that the Parade is run by a volunteer committee and they have had a mix of both local residents and local celebrities over the years.
