COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES  
BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD, NJ

A regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held remotely, at 7:00 P.M. Mayor M. James Maley, Jr. called the meeting to order, with Commissioner Robert Lewandowski present and Commissioner Morgan Robinson present.

Mayor Maley read the Sunshine Notice stating that the Borough has complied with provisions of the Sunshine Law by adopting before January 10 of this year, a resolution prescribing the dates, times and locations of all regular meetings of the Commission. Mayor Maley explained the meeting is also being live streamed. Mayor Maley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Commission of the BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD, that the following Chapter of the Borough Code be amended as follows:

**I. ENACTMENTS**

- A.) **Chapter 293, Section 61 Schedule XII** "Parking Prohibited at all Times" shall be amended to remove the following street:

Commissioner Robinson talked about the upcoming Pride Month activities coming up.

Commissioner Lewandowski reminded residents to vote tomorrow in the June Primary Election. Commissioner Lewandowski thanked Commissioner Robinson for organizing all the volunteers for the Mayfair. He also thanked the volunteers for all of their work. Commissioner Lewandowski congratulated the four Odessey of the Mind teams that competed in the Worlds Championship at Ohio State University. Commissioner Lewandowski thanked the community for helping the teams raise money so they could make the trip. Commissioner Lewandowski welcomed folks to join Robert's Pool and thanked all involved for getting the pool up and running this season. Commissioner Lewandowski talked about the ongoing issues we have with trash collection and thanked everyone for their patience.

Mayor Maley also thanked Commissioner Robinson and all the volunteers that help with the May Fair. Mayor Maley explained this was the 41st year of the Mayfair and some volunteers have been doing it since the first year. Mayor Maley said it is the volunteers that make this day so successful and we can always use the help, so please consider helping out next year. Mayor Maley gave a Parkview update that the onsite security has been changed to 24-7 security and the Borough is pleased that is happening.

### ***Public Comment***

Richard Klingerman 745 Maple Terr., asked if the incidents at the Parkview improved. Mayor Maley explained the new owners are doing more as far as safety, such as adding more cameras. Mayor Maley it will take time but things are moving in the right direction. Deputy Chief Lee added that they have seen improvements.

Ann Woodcock, 121 E Palmer Ave. asked who is paying for the lead line replacement. Mayor Maley responded the Borough. Commissioner Lewandowski explained the trench will be a few feet deep and not very wide.

Richard Klingerman 745 Maple Terr., asked what percentage of the properties in town have lead pipes? Mayor Maley explained there is still data being collected. Superintendent DiOrio said from the data collected as of now there is not many. He added we still have a large amount of data to collect.

With no comments, Mayor Maley moved the meeting be adjourned at 7:21PM, which was seconded.
