amended to remove the following street:

AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE REGARDING VARIOUS FEES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners for the Borough of Collingswood that the following chapter of the Borough Code shall be amended as follows:

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to increase fees for various Borough applications and services.

II. ENACTMENTS

A.) Article V shall be amended as follows:

- 1.) the fee for a residential zoning permit as provided in §141-13 E(1) shall be increased from \$10.00 to \$35.00;
- 2.) the fee for a commercial zoning permit as provided in §141-13 E(2) shall be increased from \$25.00 to \$50.00;
- 3.) the fee for a sign permit application as provided in §141-93 shall be \$35.00.

B.) Article I shall be amended as follows:

- 1.) the fee for each individual street opening permit as provided in Section B shall be increased from \$100.00 to \$375.00 inclusive of fee by the Borough Engineer for review of the submitted plan and inspection of the road closure.
- 2.) Section C shall be deleted.
- 3.) Section D shall be now designated as Section C.

III. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1742

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD

**AMENDING THE BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD CODE REGARDING
PARKING RESTRICTIONS**

WHEREAS, Section 293-61 Schedule XII of the Municipal Code of the Borough of Collingswood provides that a permanent parking restriction currently exists for 1.) the south side of Ogden Avenue from Haddon Avenue to North Atlantic Avenue and 2.) for the south side of Washington Avenue from Haddon Avenue to Maple Avenue; and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended to the Commissioners by the Chief of Police that the parking restrictions on Ogden Avenue are no longer necessary for that location and that removal of the restriction should not cause any traffic issue at that location; and

WHEREAS, it has also been recommended to the Commissioners by the Chief of Police that parking on the North Side of Washington Avenue from Haddon Avenue to Maple Avenue should also be subject to a permanent parking restriction but that it should also be eligible for a parking permit exception as provided in Borough Ordinance Section 293-24.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners for the Borough of Collingswood as follows: 1.) the parking restrictions on Ogden Avenue as cited herein and as provided in Section 293-61 Schedule XII of the Borough Code shall be removed and parking shall be permitted on both sides of Ogden Avenue from Haddon Avenue to North Atlantic Avenue; 2.) the north side of Washington Avenue from Haddon Avenue to Maple Avenue shall be subject to a permanent parking restriction pursuant to Section 293-61 ut shall also be eligible for a parking permit exception as provided in Borough Ordinance Section 293-24.

ORDINANCE NO. 1743

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF COLLINGSWOOD
AMENDING SECTION 163 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF
COLLINGSWOOD

WHEREAS, Chapter 163 of the Municipal Code ("Code") of the Borough of Collingswood ("Borough") provides that the New Jersey Uniform Fire Safety Act shall be locally enforced; and

WHEREAS, the local enforcement agency for the Borough is the Bureau of Fire Prevention of the Municipal Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, following a review of the applicable Borough ordinances relating to the Fire Department's responsibilities as a local enforcement agency with representatives of the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety, the Chief of the Fire Department has recommended amendments to the ordinance regarding the following sections:

- I. Section 9, subsection C, paragraph (3) titled "Business Use Group" shall have the table title amended to the following title: "Non-Life Hazard Use Commercial Property".
- II. The table of fees set forth in Section 9, subsection C. paragraph (3) shall be amended to provide as follows:

WHEREAS, the Borough's Board of Commissioners have reviewed the recommendations of the Fire Chief and wish to adopt them as proposed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Commissioners of the Borough of Collingswood that Chapter 163 of the Borough Code (entitled "Fire Prevention") shall be amended as follows:

- I. Section 9, subsection C, paragraph (3) titled "Business Use Group" shall have the table title amended to the following title: "Non-Life Hazard Use Commercial Property".
- II. The table of fees set forth in Section 9, subsection C. paragraph (3) shall be amended to provide as follows:

WHEREAS, the County of Camden, (hereinafter "COUNTY"), has entered into an Agreement with FCR Camden, LLC, d/b/a/ ReCommunity Recycling (hereinafter "OPERATOR") of Camden, New Jersey, to provide marketing services for recyclables for Camden County and its municipalities at their facility located at 2201 Mt. Ephraim Avenue, Camden, New Jersey, (hereinafter "FACILITY") under the Camden County Cooperative Pricing System ID#57-CCCPS for a term of three years on or about April 21, 2022 through April 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 32 adopted April 21, 2022, the Camden County Board of Commissioners authorized an award of contract, pursuant to a Competitive Contracting Request for Proposals #22-19, by and between the County of Camden (Division of Environmental Affairs) and FCR Camden, LLC, 2201 Mt. Ephraim Avenue, Camden, New Jersey 08104, for the provision of marketing services of single-stream recyclable materials for Camden County and participating County Municipalities under the Camden County Cooperative Pricing System, ID #57-CCCPS for a term of three (3) years commencing on or about May 1, 2022 to April 30, 2025 at the unit pricing listed in FCR's Proposal dated March 16, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 32 adopted April 21, 2022 awarded the incorrect pricing and the Resolution should have authorized the Alternate Pricing proposal as provided for in the specifications; and

WHEREAS, there was a need for the Camden County Board of Commissioners to amend Resolution No. 32, adopted April 21, 2022 as follows: to specify the award of the Alternate Pricing Proposal as permitted by the specifications; now, and Resolution No. 32 was adopted April 21, 2022, amended by Resolution on May 19, 2022 to specify the award of the alternate pricing proposal as permitted by the specifications, and

WHEREAS, this Contract is awarded pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Finance Officer certifies that funding is available in the 2022 Budget under 2-01-32-465-099 and will be included in the 2023, 2024 and 2025 Budget respectively.

**RESOLUTION REQUESTING APPROVAL OF ITEMS OF REVENUE AND
APPROPRIATION NJSA 40A:4-87**

WHEREAS, NJS 40A:4-87 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget of any county or municipality when such item shall have been made available by law and the amount was not determined at the time of the adoption of the budget; and

WHEREAS, the Director may also approve the insertion of an item of appropriation for equal amount,
