Receives emergency and business calls and dispatches law enforcement officers, fire and ambulance equipment. Does related work as required. Work is performed under the supervision of the Corrections/Communications Sergeant. An employee in this position requires certification by DPSST.



BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF CURRY, OREGON

In the Matter of a Resolution Declaring a) Local Emergency due to the Imposition of) Wildfire Hazard Map and Wildland-) Urban Interface Zone Legislation)

RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, a physical threat to government of Curry County, its citizens, and its resources both natural and infrastructure based, exists as identified by the adopted State Wildfire Hazard Map and Wildland-Urban Interface ("WUI") zones, which has resulted from the systemic failure of State and Federal agencies to manage public forest land; and those agencies' contribution to the creation of referenced Wildfire Hazard Map and WUI zones without incorporating the best available science; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2024, Permanent Administrative Order DOF 19-2024, bearing a filing caption of "Wildfire Hazard Map and Procedural Rules" was filed with the Secretary of State and Legislative Council; and

WHEREAS, DOF 19-2024 codified and made amendments to Oregon Administrative Rules 629-001-000, 629-001-0005, 629-001-0010, 629-001-0015, 629-001-0020, 629-001-0045, 629-001-0055, 629-001-0057, 629-044-1000, 629-044-1005, 629-044-1011, 629-044-1016, 629-044-1021, 629-044-1026, 629-044-1031, 629-044-1036, and 629-044-1041; and

WHEREAS, this legislative action adopted the Wildfire Hazard Map and Wildland-Urban Interface which designated wildfire hazard zones across the State of Oregon, introduced procedural rules for notification, appeals of property assignments, hearings, and delegated certain authorities to the State Forester; and

WHEREAS, the recent legislation and the resulting changes to Oregon Law as set forth above have imposed significant financial burdens on property owners in the form of required investments in costly wildfire fortifications, driving up housing costs and creating a significant financial barrier for citizens; yet the full scope of the impacts of the legislation remains uncertain, with additional consequences expected; and

WHEREAS, as the Board noted in its formal comment opposing the legislation enacted by Senate Bill 762 and Senate Bill 80, no consideration was made for the unique climate factors in Curry County; and

WHEREAS, to date, no funding has been made available to mitigate the immense challenges faced by homeowners that may be unable to comply with the resiliency requirements due to financial constraints; and

WHEREAS, only approximately four percent (4%) of land within Curry County is zoned in a manner that allows residential development; and

WHEREAS, the Wildfire Hazard Map and Wildland-Urban Interface legislation critically limits Curry County's ability to address the much-needed housing crisis; and

WHEREAS, since 2002, approximately 750,000 acres of Curry County forestland, the majority of which is Federally managed, has been burned by wildfires as a direct result of the State and Federal government's failure to maintain those forests in a manner that minimizes the risk of wildfire while only six structures have been lost to fire; and

WHEREAS, the failure of State legislation to address the lack of public forest management poses physical safety risks and financial burdens to County residents and visitors, yet no requirements have been imposed on State and Federal agencies to address such mismanagement; and

WHEREAS, an undue financial burden on the citizens of Curry County is imminent due to the legislative directives to modify building and planning regulations; and

WHEREAS, the indirect results of these legislative directives will cause extreme negative impacts to Curry County and its 42 Special Districts, including Fire Departments, Hospitals, Ambulance Services, and Libraries; and

WHEREAS, a Fifth Amendment taking without just compensation has been enacted; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Curry County Commissioners has a duty to safeguard the health, safety, and welfare of Curry County citizens as set forth by the 10th Amendment of the United States Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Pursuant to ORS 401.309, the Curry County Board of Commissioners declares that a Local State of Emergency exists within Curry County due to the impacts of DOF 19-2024 and related legislation that threatens the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Curry County.

- 2. This State of Emergency shall remain in effect until the regulations imposed by the legislation discussed above is modified or repealed, unless otherwise ordered by the Curry County Board of Commissioners.
- 3. A moratorium is imposed on any and all building and planning code changes related to this legislation.
- 4. The County formally declares its intention to assume its Constitutional management authority over all public forest lands within the metes and bounds of its border.
