WHEREAS, a written Petition dated March 11, 2021, has been presented and filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Geneva, Ontario County, New York, requesting establishment of Extension to Sewer District No. 1 ("District") with boundaries as described in a Map, Plan and Report relating to the establishment of the District, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and the Map, Plan and Report, last dated February 2021, was prepared by Bergmann Associates in a manner and such detail as has been determined by this Town Board to be sufficient and has been duly filed with the Town Clerk, in accordance with the requirements of Article 12 of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, an Order was duly adopted by this Town Board on April 13th, 2021, reciting the filing of said Map, Plan and Report, the improvements proposed, the boundaries of the proposed District, the fact that the Map, Plan and Report describing the same were on file in the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection, and stating all other matters required by law to be stated, and specifying May 11, 2021, at 6:00 p.m., at the Town of Geneva Town Hall, 3750 County Road 6, Geneva, New York, as the place where this Town Board would meet and consider said Map, Plan and Report and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same, and to take such action thereon as required or authorized by law; and

WHEREAS, the hearing on said matter was duly held by said Town Board on May 11, 2021, at the Geneva Town Hall, at which all interested persons desiring to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act) of the Environmental Conservation Law it has been determined previously by the Town Planning Board that approval of this District would not have a significant effect upon the environment and could be processed by other applicable governmental agencies without further regard to SEQR.

Economic Development –

Sustainability – (1) the town is sponsoring “Free Stuff Day” at the Recycling and Disposal Station on Sunday, May 16; from 10-noon people can drop off useful items in working condition, and from noon-2, people can take these items, no charge; whatever is left will be taken to places that can use them like the Salvation Army.

(2) the town and city are working together on a mattress collection event that will be held at the town Recycling and Disposal Station on Saturday, August 7; a truck will be parked in the lot in front of the water-sewer building and people will drive through and drop off mattresses, which will be taken to a recycler near Buffalo; county funding was obtained to cover the cost.

Agricultural Enhancement –

19. Supervisor’s Report:

The town entered into a Community Choice Aggregation Electricity Supply Agreement with Constellation NewEnergy Inc., a company the town has done business with in the past. Constellation was one of five companies that bid to be the town’s electricity supplier in the CCA program, and was chosen based on price and experience. The town’s administrator for the CCA program, Joule Assets, Inc., recommended the selection of Constellation. Town residents will have three options with Constellation, standard fossil fuel, 50-50 renewable, and 100% renewable, or to opt out entirely. The default will be 100% renewable, which will cost about \$3 per month more than standard fossil fuels.

CCMI, Inc., which is planning purchase property and build a new manufacturing facility in the Town on Route 14 north, has submitted its grant application for CDBG funding to support the construction of its facility and it looks promising. The town board previously approved supporting this application.

Jim Martinez, who designed and led the construction of the town bike park, will return the weekend of May 22-23 to give a dirt workshop for the Friends of the Geneva Bike Park and work with them to resurface the park, at a cost of about \$1,000.00. Anyone interested in helping should contact the supervisor by calling the town hall or at supervisor@townofgeneva.com.

The town was successful in being one of the first five applicants to approve the Conservation Kick program of the Great Lakes Commission and will receive \$10,000.00 to be used toward a project that will reduce storm-water pollution on a town farm; it will be matched with \$10,000.00 from the town’s storm-water control fund. Ontario County Soil and Water Conservation District agents are working with the town to identify and design an appropriate project that will be constructed this year. At this time the Cornell farm west of Carter Road that dumps a lot of storm-water on Carter Road residences and that runs east to the lake and has caused flooding in the North Genesee Street area in the past is the primary target.

The application for grant funding for a phosphorous removal trial from farm field tile drainage that was approved by the town board was successful, and the trial will be undertaken by Seneca Watershed Steward Ian Smith and the Finger Lakes Institute of Hobart & William Smith Colleges.

First quarter 2021 sales tax revenue to the Town was up 3.90% over the same quarter in 2020.

The town's code review committee has been meeting and should have proposals for the town board to consider at its June meeting.

The supervisor and water-sewer superintendent, with review by the town attorney, have been working on a new agreement with the city for use of its waste water treatment plant, and revisions to the town's sewer code to make it consistent with the city's sewer code. An agreement and proposed local law should be available for review by the town board at its June meeting.

The town is applying with the county for a summer youth employee paid by the county to assist at the Recycling and Disposal Station.

The town's request to lower the speed limit on Carter Road was turned down by the NYS DOT again.
