A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c

Section 1: Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Geneva, County of Ontario pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Geneva to adopt a town budget for (a) town purposes (b) fire protection districts and (c) any other special or improvement district governed by the town board for the fiscal year 2020 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

1.1 SECTION 2: AUTHORITY

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the town board to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of the town board.

Section 3: Tax Levy Limit Override

The Town Board of the Town of Geneva, County of Ontario, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2020 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 4: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Local Law No. 3 of the year 2019

A local law **"Approving with Conditions the Rezoning of a Parcel of Land to PUD Planned Unit Development and Amending the Official Zoning Map of the Town of Geneva in Accordance with Such Approval"**

Be it enacted by the **Town Board** (Name of Legislative Body)

as follows:

Section 1: The Official Zoning Map of the Town of Geneva, adopted pursuant to Section 165-5 of the Zoning Law of the Town of Geneva, is hereby amended as follows:

Tax Account No. 133.00-1-020.000, containing a total of 151.425 acres of land (including the Turk Road right of way), with the area of this parcel on the west side of New York State Route 14 (including the Turk Road right of way), consisting of 146.472 acres of said total being currently zoned AG Agricultural District and with the two areas of this parcel east of New York State Route 14, consisting of 4.710 acres and 0.243 acre, respectively, of said total being currently zoned R-3 Residential Lakefront District, is rezoned in its entirety to PUD Planned Unit Development District subject to the following conditions:

1. Adherence to the National Association of City Transportation Officials urban street design principles that streets are public spaces for people as well as arteries for traffic and transportation, and that street design should meet the needs of people walking, driving, cycling, and taking transit.
2. Adherence to the National Association of City Transportation Officials green streets principles that street design should promote safety and mobility, sustainable stormwater management and treatment, ecosystem health and urban resilience.
3. Design of stormwater management and treatment facilities to maximize use of green infrastructure and onsite infiltration of stormwater, and where practicable incorporation of stormwater treatment facilities as amenities into any proposed open space and recreation areas.
4. Incorporation into the site plan of a right-of-way reservation not less than six (6) feet wide for a bicycle and pedestrian route, to run roughly parallel to White Springs Brook or between the proposed residential areas and golf course south of Turk Road, to run from the northwest corner of the Bayview Phase II site to NYS14 at the southeast corner of the site.
5. Adherence to the standards for outdoor lighting set forth in Section 165-36 of the Town of Geneva Zoning Code, and wherever practicable incorporate use of LED and other low energy consumption lighting technology into the site design.
6. Integrate wherever practicable renewable energy sources and/or energy conservation facilities and equipment into the project design.
7. Letter of Credit for the benefit of the Town of Geneva to cover construction and, if needed, removal of each phase of the project and restoration, to include all dedicated utilities and/or roads.
8. A two-year maintenance bond or guaranty is required for all landscaping upon completion of its installation.
9. Whatever is constructed on the building pad on the east side of the project next to State Route 14 shall comply with Town of Geneva Zoning Code Section 165-19. Lake View Overlay District, regarding permitted uses, design and operating standards, and buffer requirements, subject to review by the Town Zoning Board of Appeals.
10. The townhome road shall be looped and not a cul-de-sac, and shall be 26 feet wide with one-foot gutters on each side.
11. The water system for the Townhome section shall be looped to State Route 14 or back to Turk Road.
12. There shall be 360 degree access provided around all three of the buildings proposed on the north side of Turk Road.
13. The detention pond near the condominiums shall be designed as a draft-able source for fire department use in an emergency.
14. Fire hydrants shall be placed in accordance with the approval of the fire department and Town Code Enforcement Officer.
15. The entrance of the townhome road shall comply with NYS Department of Transportation sight distance requirements for the speed limit on Turk Road and shall have a right turn lane going east on Turk Road as well as a right only turn out of the residential portion south of Turk Road.
16. Final site plan review shall be completed with both the Town Planning Board, for compliance with the Town's Planned Unit Development regulations, and the Zoning Board of Appeals, for compliance with the applicable sections of the Lake View Overlay District.
17. Only the uses and layout, including, but not limited to, setbacks and acreage of open space, set forth on the Planned Unit Development plans of Passero Associates dated January 20, 2019 and last revised and received by the town on February 21, 2019 that are on file with the Town shall be part of any final site plan approval.
18. Adherence to all requirements from Ontario County Soil and Water Conservation District and/or Finger Lakes Institute on the proposed stormwater management to ensure preservation of Seneca Lake water quality. For any comments or recommendations provided by Ontario County Soil and Water Conservation District and/or Finger Lakes Institute, the Planning Board shall consider them all in determining whether to approve, approve with modifications or conditions or deny the final site plan on the project associated with this property and this rezoning.

Section 2: The Town Clerk, in accordance with the provisions contained in Section 165-5 of the Zoning Law of the Town of Geneva and upon final site plan approval by the Planning Board in accordance with Article V of the Zoning Law of the Town of Geneva shall affix a note to the Town's Official Zoning Map that the development of the above referenced site was approved under the Town's PUD Planned Unit Development zoning provisions, including a reference date to the date such action was taken by the Planning Board and cause the Official Zoning Map of the Town of Geneva to be amended to show the entirety of Tax Account No. 133.00-1-020.000 to now be zoned PUD Planned Unit Development.

Section 3: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been ordered.

Section 4: This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

23. Supervisor's Report:

Seneca Watershed Steward. The top four candidates (out of about 30 applicants) were interviewed for the position of Seneca Watershed Steward and an offer has been made to the unanimous top pick of the interview committee, and he accepted, subject to a check of his references and finalizing the hire. He is expected to begin the first week of April. He will assist with the development of the Nine Element Watershed Plan that will begin this year and managing the Seneca Watershed Intermunicipal Organization, which the town supervisor chairs.

Geneva Community Power. This program, brought to the town by its consultant, Joule Community Power, is moving forward with people signing up to enroll in the program, which will provide about 10% in electric bill savings for each person who enrolls, electricity being supplied by a solar farm, and \$25,000 to the town to use on a sustainability project. About 100 people are currently enrolled; 400 are needed. Any NYSEG customer in the area (not just town residents or business owners) can participate. There is no charge to sign up and no cost to the town.

Water System Upgrade. BEM, the company working with the town on siting a new well, will be on site doing core samples within the next two weeks. We are moving forward with state grant compliance and working with the Town of Seneca. We have agreed on a new placement for the new storage tank in the Town of Seneca that is part of the project and this will require the town board to redo SEQR and the bond resolution which we will take up at a later meeting.

Charter Underpayment. Troy & Banks, the company that audited town utility suppliers to see if the town was being overcharged or underpaid, determined Charter has underpaid the town for franchise fees over the past few years. Charter disagrees, and Troy & Banks has filed a complaint with the Public Service Commission on behalf of the town to attempt to resolve the dispute.
