WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Geneva, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interests of the Town to schedule a public hearing to solicit public comment upon a proposed Local Law entitled "A Local Law Amending Chapter 150 (Vehicles, Abandoned, and

Property and Sidewalk Maintenance) of the Code of the Town of Geneva" and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Geneva has reviewed the draft of the aforementioned proposed Local Law, attached hereto as Exhibit "1", and deems it in the best interests of the Town of Geneva to proceed in accordance with the Code of the Town of Geneva and the Laws of the State of New York in adopting said Local Law, and

WHEREAS, this action by the Town Board is a "Type II" action under the regulations promulgated by authority contained in the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), which appear in 6 NYCRR Part 617.5, thereby requiring no further action by the Town Board, in that Part 617.5 (c) states that actions that are not subject to review under SEQRA include, "(27) adoption of regulations, policies, procedures and local legislative decisions in connection with any action on this list" and subsection (20) on this list includes "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment". This action involves continuing agency administration and management in that it will enact a law amending the Town's property maintenance law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Clerk be, and she hereby is, directed to schedule a public hearing to be held on <u>December 10,, 2019, at 6:30 p.m.</u> at the Geneva Town Hall, 3750 County Road 6, Geneva, New York; and be it further

A local law "Amending Chapter 150 (Vehicles, Abandoned, and Property and Sidewalk Maintenance) of the Code of the Town of Geneva"

- §§150-6, 150-7 and 150-8 of Article III of Chapter 150 of the Code of the Town of Geneva are hereby renumbered to be Section 1. §§150-8, 150-9 and 150-10 respectively.
- §§150-9, 150-10, 150-11, 150-12, 150-13, 150-14, 150-15, 150-16 and 150-17 of Article IV of Chapter 150 of the Code Section 2. of the Town of Geneva are hereby renumbered to be §§150-11, 150-12 and 150-13, 150-14, 150-15, 150-16, 150-17, 150-18 and 150-19 respectively.
- Section 3. Article II of Chapter 150 of the Code of the Town of Geneva is hereby amended with the addition of new §§150-6 and 150-7, which shall read as follows:

**Definitions** §150-6

For purposes of this Chapter, the following words shall have the following definitions:

Weeds: All grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees, shrubs and cultivated flowers and gardens.

Yard: The area on all sides of every structure on a property; for each such structure, said area shall be equal to the

setbacks of the zoning district as measured from the sides of each structure, but in no case shall any said area

be less than 25 feet on all sides of the structure or to the property line, whichever is less.

§150-7 Yard Maintenance

All yards on a property shall be maintained free of weeds and noxious plant growth in excess of 10 inches.

- Paragraph A of §150-14 of Article IV of Chapter 150 of the Code of the Town of Geneva is hereby amended by changing Section 4. the reference to "§ 150-11" therein to "§ 150-13"
- The heading and Paragraphs A and B of §150-15 of Article IV of Chapter 150 of the Code of the Town of Geneva are Section 5. hereby amended by changing the references to "§ 150-7" and "§ 150-8" therein to "§ 150-9" and "§ 150-10" respectively.
- If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction Section 6. to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been ordered.
- Section 7. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

# 15. 2019 RESOLUTION NO. 87-2019: - Approving Proposal for HVAC Improvements.

WHEREAS most of the HVAC equipment at the town hall is twenty years old, has been requiring expensive repairs to keep operational, and some components that have failed are beyond repair, making the system unable to provide adequate heat to all parts of the town hall as temperatures drop; and

WHEREAS Interstate Heating, Inc. has been servicing the town's HVAC system for the past two years and recommended replacing the components of the system that are original or can no longer be repaired, at a cost of \$42,200; and

WHEREAS state law and the town's procurement policy require public bidding for purchase contracts totaling \$20,000 or more unless there is an emergency need or the contract is for services where special or technical skill, training or expertise is needed; and

WHEREAS the evaluation of the HVAC system and components, the selection of new components and their interface with the system, and the installation and tuning of system components requires technicians with special training and skill, and makes this procurement eligible as an exception to the requirements of public bidding, which the town board so finds; and

WHEREAS the town sought and received proposals from three qualified companies who sent technicians to evaluate the HVAC system at the town hall, Interstate Heating, Isaac, and E&V, and each made a proposal to undertake the project, without knowledge of the proposal of the other bidders; and

WHEREAS the three proposals are about the same in what they cover, and the prices were Interstate \$39,200, Isaac \$41,950, and E&V \$44,821.86; and

WHEREAS accepting the proposal of Interstate is in the best interest of the town because it is the low proposal, Interstate has been servicing the town's HVAC system for the past two years, and its familiarity with it will be an advantage for installation and servicing in the future: now therefore, it is

RESOLVED the proposal of Interstate Heating may be accepted, and the Supervisor is authorized to enter into a contract with Interstate for the proposed work at the quoted price.

#### 24. Supervisor's Report;

I signed and returned the dog control contract with Ontario County for 2020. The county, through the Ontario County Humane Society, provides dog control services for the towns, cities and villages in the county.

We had a successful Fix-It Clinic on October 26, with the help of two town employees, Dan Mahoney and Jim Reed, as well as seamstress Rene Ryan and Jacob and Mark. Prior to the 26<sup>th</sup>, Charlie and his crew fixed most of the items that had been dropped off at the station shed in advance. Items fixed included several lamps, a table, several items of clothing mended, stereo receiver (partially fixed), and a weed trimmer still in progress.

We had a successful first Senior Citizen Clean-out day assisted by town employees. Jacob coordinated with eight town residents and they picked up old usable items to donate to the Salvation Army, including chairs, tools, benches, books and book cases, a bed frame and lots of wood. People were very happy with the service.

We held a meeting at the town hall on October 28 for people to ask questions about the town's two renewable energy programs that was attended by the CEO of Joule Assets, the town's program administrator, and about a dozen residents.

The town hosted a meeting of the Seneca Watershed Intermunicipal Organization on October 29 that was well attended and included presentations on Harmful Algal Bloom and stream monitoring that is taking place, and work on a model septic system inspection law. This was followed by a meeting on the Nine-Element Seneca Watershed Plan which introduced the plan to the approximately 50 people who attended and encouraged people to join the Project Advisory Committee for the Plan, which will take at least two years to complete. The executive committee of the Nine-Element Plan meets at the town hall on the first Thursday of the month, the last one being on November 7.

A rep from the State Comptroller's office will be at the town hall doing a tax cap compliance review on November 15.
