**1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL**

The regular meeting of the Historic Preservation Commission of the Village of Glencoe conducted virtually in accordance with Governor Pritzker’s Executive Order 2020-74 was called to order by the Commission Chair Peter Van Vechten at 5:32 p.m. on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2021.

Prior to roll call, Chair Van Vechten stated that pursuant to recently adopted amendments to the Illinois Open Meetings Act (OMA) included in Public Act 101-0640, the Historic Preservation Commission meeting was being conducted as a virtual meeting via Zoom video conferencing software. He also stated that a quorum of members of the Commission were present via remote access and that Assistant to the Village Manager Jordan Lester was physically present at Village Hall as required by OMA.

**4. CONTINUED DISCUSSION OF NEIGHBORING COMMUNITIES’ PRESERVATION ORDINANCES**

In particular, she reported on the Villages of Winnetka and Lake Bluff, noting that both communities were researching historic preservation ordinances. She stated that a historic Winnetka home, located at 740 Ardsley Road, was in danger of demolition and that both members of Winnetka’s Landmark Preservation Commission and the public had expressed opposition to the proposed demolition.

Assistant to the Village Manager Lester reported that she had been in contact with staff liaisons from both communities and that she would continue to provide the Commission with updates as they became available.

Commissioners briefly discussed and asked Assistant to the Village Manager Lester questions about the Forest Edge Subdivision and the Village’s community solar program. Assistant to the Village Manager Lester also provided the Commission with a brief update on Cook County Department of Public Health COVID-19 vaccine information.
