4. DISCUSSION OF APRIL 19, 2018 VILLAGE BOARD COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE PRESENTATION

The Commission continued discussion regarding the its upcoming Committee of the Whole presentation to the Village Board on Thursday, April 19. Commissioners reviewed a preliminary draft of municipal code

recommendations and decided to prepare suggestions and additional recommendations for the Commission’s next meeting on April 3. The Commission discussed the potential of moving the Committee presentation to a later date as well.

5. DISCUSSION OF VILLAGE SESQUICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION PROGRAM

Chairman Scheckelhoff provided a brief overview of the Sesquicentennial Planning Group’s February 26 “Committee of the Whole” meeting at Writers Theatre. He shared that the Planning Group invited representatives from each Glencoe community organization to attend the meeting and learn about ways to contribute to the celebration of the Village’s 150th Anniversary in 2019. The year-long celebration will kick off in November 2018. Commissioner Van Vechten, whom also is part of the Planning Group and Historical Society, provided additional insight into Sesquicentennial events. The Commission discussed potential ideas for participation, such as incorporating Frank Lloyd Wright designs into community gateways. Murals were discussed as well.

6. STANDING PROJECTS

The Commission viewed the online Historic Glencoe Story-Map and provided suggested edits to the Map’s design. In addition, Commissioner Turner asked for information regarding fencing on Sheridan Road, which currently has sections in need of repair. Ms. Lester stated that she would research the item and report back to the Commission with additional information.

7. REVIEW INQUIRIES, DEMOLITION APPLICATIONS, AND OUTREACH

Ms. Lester reported that representatives for the owner of 239 Franklin Road, Frank Lloyd Wright’s Summer Cottage, had contacted the Village for information regarding the certification process for current Village honorary landmarks. She stated that she will provide the Commission with new details if they emerge.
