VILLAGE ANNOUNCES UPCOMING RETIREMENTS OF PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR DAVID MAU AND PUBLIC SAFETY DIRECTOR CARY LEWANDOWSKI AFTER DECADES OF SERVICE

After decades of exemplary public service and dedication to the Glencoe community, Public Works Director David Mau and Public Safety Director Cary Lewandowski have announced their respective plans for retirement in 2023.

Mau will retire on August 1, 2023 after 33 years of service to Glencoe, where he spent the majority of his 39-year career. He was hired in 1990 as the Village's Assistant Engineer and in 1996 was promoted to serve as the Public Works Director. "For more than 30 years, Dave has epitomized public service and leaves a tremendous mark on the community. He has capably guided numerous significant infrastructure improvements, developed wonderful relationships with residents and has served the community with the utmost professionalism, kindness and humility," said Village Manager Phil Kiraly.

Lewandowski will retire on September 1, 2023, after a 37-year career in law enforcement. He was hired in 2013 to lead Glencoe's Public Safety Department after serving more than 27 years with the Lincolnwood Police Department. "Cary has led the Public Safety Department with great care and steadiness, in both times of great successes and through unthinkable challenges, including the Village's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the tragic Highland Park shooting. In everything he does, Cary serves with great integrity and selflessness," Kiraly said.

"Given their substantial tenure, significant impacts on the Village, and exemplary abilities in their respective fields, there is no doubt that their loss will be significant to our organization and the community. I'm grateful that Dave and Cary have each given the Village ample advanced notice of their retirements and continue to be thoughtful of the entire organization and the Glencoe community as they approach these well-earned milestones in their careers," Kiraly said.

The Village plans to commence an executive search process for both positions this spring, with the intent of naming successors in line with Lewandowski's and Mau's respective retirement dates. The process will be comprehensive, with a

nationwide candidate search. "Finding successors that will carry forward both Dave's and Cary's commitment to service and leadership, paired with the vision to steer these critically important operational departments into the future will be our primary goal," noted Kiraly.

"On behalf of the entire Village, I wish to congratulate both Dave and Cary on their much-deserved retirements. We thank each of you for your years of dedicated service to the community and the tremendous positive impact you have had on Glencoe," noted Village President Howard Roin.

The Village plans to share more information celebrating Lewandowski's and Mau's accomplished careers as their respective retirement dates approach, as well as information regarding public open house events for the entire community to celebrate their time in Glencoe and wish them well.
