GOLF ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
Meeting Minutes  
August 19, 2019

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

The Golf Advisory Committee was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Glencoe Golf Club. The following members were present:

2. CONSIDER THE 2019 JULY MINUTES

The July Golf Advisory Committee meeting minutes were approved as submitted.

3. MANAGER'S MONTHLY REPORT

- Stella reviewed the financial statement and monthly report for July. July continued the trend of above average rainfall resulting in one day of zero revenue and power cart use prohibited five days out of the month.
- Stella explained that the financial statements have a different look due to the new system that has been integrated at the Village. Stella and staff will work to make the new reports mirror the old reports.
- The USB ports on the golf carts were discussed. The committee thought they were a great idea and an added amenity that most golfers appreciate.
- Ongoing drainage repairs throughout the course were discussed. Stella explained that the drainage issues were due to the non-stop rain events in June combined with the heavy rain events in July and the inability of the golf course to completely drain.
- Stella informed the committee that the 6-inch main line of the irrigation system blew out of the ground causing excessive damage to the fairway on #9. The repair work was completed in house saving over \$5,000 in repairs. This line is responsible for all irrigation on the front nine, so the speed of repair was crucial.
- Capital projects were discussed including the 16<sup>th</sup> green extension which allows for four additional pin placements.
- Stella informed the committee that the Golf Academy revenues are up 8% compared to last season, Glencoe residents comprise 85% of summer camp attendees.
- Golf Now was discussed along with its availability to mobile users. The millennials use of their phone for all aspects of their life was discussed.
- The lack of availability of power carts due to wet conditions was discussed.

4. OTHER BUSINESS

- The change in ownership of Hel's Kitchen was discussed along with plans for restaurant service for next season.
- Special events were discussed including the Play for PINK event that was sponsored by the Ladies League that raised over \$5,700 for the breast cancer research foundation.
- The closing of Sportsman's Golf Club in 2020 due to renovations was discussed.
- Discussions of new revenue sources was discussed including netting on the driving range to allow for the use of drivers.

6. ADJOURNMENT

- There being no further business for discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 7:41 p.m.
