Meeting Minutes  
May 20, 2019

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

The Golf Advisory Committee was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at Village Hall. The following members were present:

2. CONSIDER THE 2019 APRIL MINUTES

The April Golf Advisory Committee meeting minutes were approved as submitted.

3. MANAGER'S MONTHLY REPORT

- Stella reviewed the financial statement for April. The course dealt with challenging weather including below average temperatures and higher than average precipitation including two measurable snowfall events.
- The lack of play did give maintenance the opportunity to work on some side jobs including repairing broken drainage on two fairways and repairing drainage in the fairway bunker on #9. A new drain was also added to the dogleg portion of #17 which was a large project but should help immensely with drainage on that part of the golf course.
- The expansion project on #16 green started and will add additional pin placements towards the back left of the green.
- The IPGA held their senior stroke play at the course which included over 50 local IPGA professionals. The course received many compliments.
- Unplanned tree work was needed to remove four dead red oak trees which were a safety hazard.
- Senior membership sales have been strong which was a pleasant surprise due to Sunset Valley GC reopening.
- A comment was made that completing the capital projects in-house has saved the golf course an incredible amount of money over the years versus hiring outside companies to complete the jobs.

4. OTHER BUSINESS

- A recommendation was made that the course research the PGA Reach Program which runs instructional programs for veterans and children with visual and physical impairments. Dr. Shore was going to look further into the programs to see if it would be a good fit for the GGC.
- Stella mentioned that the CDGA has a program very similar called Sunshine Through Golf which is run at Great Lakes Naval. Stella has contacted them previously and, although special qualifications are needed to teach, Stella offered use of the golf course and range. CDGA was more interested in PGA professionals volunteering at Great Lakes but not in utilizing GGC as a facility at the time. Stella will circle back with them.
- There are currently 78 spots sold for the Tri Club golf event. The private clubs still have their spots to fill. Any unused spots will be sold to those on the waiting list. The GM's at both the clubs have been extremely supportive of this event.
- Senior Scramble and the Par 3 Shootout are the next upcoming events in June.
- Wednesday night twilight league will begin in June and has a lot of new members signed up this year.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT TIME

- Dale added that he, Stella, and Larry will be meeting with fundraising consultants in the upcoming week to move forward developing a fundraising plan for a new clubhouse.
