Updates to the City's FARR Grant Application

The City of Highland Park has updated the <u>FARR</u> <u>Grant Application</u>. Applicants are now required to submit hard copies of all documents along with a current W9.



Applications may be submitted via dropbox (located on Hazel Avenue, adjacent to City Hall.) or mail (City of Highland Park, Office of Business Development, 1707 St. Johns Avenue, Highland Park II, 60005). Emailed application

Highland Park IL 60035). **Emailed applications will not be accepted.**

In October 2020, the City of Highland Park announced a matching grant program to assist small businesses in weathering the economic impacts of the coronavirus pandemic in light of challenges posed by winter weather and a resurgence of COVID-19. The Financial Assistance for Retailers and Restaurants (FARR) Grant Program designates \$255,000 in funding to support COVID-19-related operational costs incurred by restaurants and retail establishments to provide for a safe environment for customers and staff in compliance with state and federal public health guidelines. The program accepts applications from qualifying small businesses located and operating within a commercial building in Highland Park with a net worth of less than \$2 million and generating less than an average of \$200,000 in profit per year for two years after taxes. *More information is available here*.

Opportunities For Small Business Funding In Illinois

Paycheck Protection Program Now Accepting Applications

This round of the PPP continues to prioritize millions of Americans employed by small businesses by authorizing up to \$284 billion toward job retention and certain other expenses through March 31, 2021. It also allows certain existing PPP borrowers to apply for a Second Draw PPP Loan. PPP has successfully provided 5.2 million loans worth \$525 billion to

America's small businesses.

Apply here for <u>First Draw PPP Loan</u>, or apply here for <u>Second Draw</u> <u>PPP Loan</u>.

Key updates include:

- PPP borrowers can set their PPP loan's covered period to be any length between 8 and 24 weeks to best meet their business needs;
- PPP loans will cover additional expenses, including operations expenditures, property damage costs, supplier costs, and worker protection expenditures;
- The Program's eligibility is expanded to include 501(c)(6)s, housing cooperatives, direct marketing organizations, among other types of organizations;
- The PPP provides greater flexibility for seasonal employees; A borrower is generally eligible for a Second Draw PPP Loan if the borrower:
- Previously received a First Draw PPP Loan and will or has used the full amount only for authorized uses;
- Has no more than 300 employees; and
- Can demonstrate at least a 25% reduction in gross receipts between comparable quarters in 2019 and 2020.

Economic Injury Disaster Loans – Currently Accepting Applications

The SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program announced that the application deadline has been extended to Dec. 31, 2021, as a result of the recent stimulus bill. These SBA loans provide small businesses with a long-term, low-interest loan to help them survive the COVID-19 crisis. Note that these are loans and not grants like the PPP may turn into. Applicants can apply for both EIDL and PPP loans simultaneously, although the funds cannot be used for the same purpose.

Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) Expanded

The recent COVID stimulus bill extends and expands the CARES Act's refundable ERTC, which encourages businesses to keep more workers on payroll.

To receive this credit, eligible employers can report wages on their quarterly employment tax returns with *Form 941*.

Key updates to the ERTC under the new stimulus bill include:

- Businesses can now take advantage of both PPP and the ERTC
- For wages paid after January 1, 2021, the ERTC can be applied to 70% of qualifying wages of up to \$10,000 per quarter
- Businesses with 500 or fewer employees are eligible to claim the ERTC if they had a revenue reduction of 20% or more in 2020
- ullet Businesses must have partially or fully suspended all operations in 2020 or 2021 to qualify



SBA to Host Shuttered Venue Operators Grant Webinar Thursday, January 14 2 PM

The U.S. Small Business Administration is hosting a webinar to give a preliminary overview of the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant program included in the Economic Aid to Hard-Hit Small Businesses, Nonprofits, and Venues Act. Eligible organizations with a reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have the opportunity to receive up to a \$10 million grant under the program. This webinar will provide introductory information about the grants, who can apply, how potential organizations can prepare, and additional details regarding eligibility and applications.


