Business Registration Renewals Due December 29

SET UP YOUR NEW ACCOUNT!

Have you renewed your 2024 business registration and license(s)? An automatic email will be sent out this week to all businesses as a friendly reminder. **If you already renewed and received an email confirmation of your payment, you can disregard the email.**

To renew your business registration and license(s), you must sign up for a *new* account online and complete the payment process by 5pm, December 29. [Here is the link to a User Guide with detailed instructions to assist with account set up.](#)

The steps for account set up are also outlined below:

- 1) [Click here](#) to visit the Self Service payment portal.
- 2) Click on the “Login or Register” box to access a “Sign in” box.
- 3) **Scroll down to the bottom of the “Sign in” box** and follow the instructions for **“Don’t have an account? Sign up.”**

- 4) Click the “Sign up” link and complete the instructions.

NOTE: Enter the email address with which you used to register your business in previous years. If you do not remember that email address or aren’t sure, contact the City via email at cmolicense@cityhpil.com or by phone at 847.926.1000 for assistance.

- 5) You should now be in your business Dashboard where you can access permits and licenses for renewal. If you do not see that information, contact the City via email at cmolicense@cityhpil.com or by phone at 847.926.1000 for assistance.

- 6) Click the “renew” button(s) to follow the steps for license renewal.

[Illinois B2B NewBiz](#) will provide financial relief to businesses that started during the pandemic in the industries most impacted by the pandemic. Businesses that started during the pandemic have not been eligible for state grants and most federal emergency support provided for emergency relief to small businesses thus far.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for a grant award under Illinois B2B NewBiz, for-profit businesses and nonprofit organizations must meet all the criteria listed below:

1. Started operations between January 1, 2020, and December 31, 2021.
 2. Had gross receipts of at least \$25,000 and up to \$20,000,000 in 2021 (annualized if started during 2021).
 3. Currently active operations in Illinois.
 4. Have not received a Back to Business (B2B) grant prior to 2023.
 - Business Interruption Grant (BIG), Back to Business (B2B) Grant issued prior to 2023, Shuttered Venue Operators Grant (SVOG), or Restaurant Revitalization Fund Grant (RRF).
1. Must meet one of the following two criteria:
 - The business or nonprofit is in a priority industry as defined for the previous Back to Business program
 1. A list of priority industries and their definitions can be found [here](#).
 - The business is majority owned by an individual or individuals that became eligible for and received unemployment insurance benefits – including from Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) – between March 13, 2020, and the date the business began operations.

Please inform your customers that they will be able to shop local and park longer this holiday season! The City of Highland Park encourages residents and visitors to shop and dine locally this holiday season with extended parking hours **through Friday, January 5, 2024.**

Parking restrictions will be suspended at all municipal parking lots. There will be no time limit enforced at these public lots. Disabled parking, fire hydrant zones, loading zones, and on-street customer-only parking will remain in effect. Permit parking will remain in effect during these parking holidays. Employee parking restrictions will be strictly enforced.

Please note: EV charging areas will be enforced to give multiple individuals the opportunity to use the service.

Illinois EPA Electric Vehicle Rebate Program Funding

[The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency](#) (Illinois EPA) is announcing that the next funding round for Illinois' Electric Vehicle (EV) Rebate Program will open Wednesday, November 1, 2023, and run through Wednesday, January 31, 2024. Individuals who purchase a new or used all-electric vehicle from an Illinois licensed dealer, meet all other eligibility requirements, and apply during the rebate cycle will be eligible for a rebate as long as funds are available.
