Senior Center Relocation Update

The City of Highland Park is excited about plans to move Senior Services to the Highland Park Country Club, and is taking steps in that direction. Capital improvement projects have been included in the long-range budget, including \$480 thousand for roof replacement (2019), \$360 thousand for HVAC replacement (2020), \$1 million for parking lot repair and redevelopment (2022), and \$3.5 million for interior renovation (2022).

Beginning September 9, Senior Services will move activities that are currently being held off-site, to the Highland Park Country Club.

Programs being relocated to the Country Club include: Monday Speaker Series, Monday at the Movies, Blood Pressure Screening, Barry Bradford Presents, AARP Smart Driver Course, and the Laurel Larks.

Staff looks forward to this positive change.


