February 28 1920 (100 years ago)

1920 was a dynamic and exciting year! The "Roaring 20s" were ushered in by women getting the right to vote, Prohibition, the rise of the Mafia, a new found love of movies and sports, and the start of the "Flapper Era!" A decade of prosperity began, but civil unrest and natural disasters would make 1920 an unforgettable year!

March 27 1945 (75 Years Ago)

The end of World War II was the start of the Atomic Era. America was overwhelmed by joy as V-E Day and V-J Day were celebrated but mourned the loss of FDR, thousands of soldiers and the discovery of the extent of the Holocaust. 
