

**SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REGARDING GOLF AND FACE COVERINGS  
MADE PURSUANT TO DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY  
CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK  
APRIL 30, 2020**

I, Mayor Nancy R. Rotering, do hereby issue the following supplemental emergency order for the City of Highland Park this 30<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2020 ("***Supplemental Order***").

Introduction

On March 14, 2020, I issued a Declaration of Emergency pursuant to the authority granted to me by: Section 92.105 of "The Highland Park Code of 1968," as amended; Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1- 6; and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/11 to address the health threat posed by the COVID-19 pandemic ("***Declaration***").

The Declaration granted and reserved emergency powers to the Mayor during the pendency of the civil emergency, including the right to issue additional emergency regulations and orders in furtherance of the Declaration.

Since issuance of the Declaration, the corporate authorities of the City of Highland Park have twice approved and extended the duration of the Declaration. As of the date of these Supplemental Orders, the Declaration has been extended through and until May 11, 2020.

In Executive Order No. 2020-10, issued on March 20, 2020, Governor Pritzker directed residents of Illinois to stay at home, subject to limited exceptions, and non-essential businesses to cease operations with limited exceptions. ("***Original Stay-at-Home Order***"). The Original Stay-at-Home Order has been extended through April 30, 2020.

In Executive Order No. 2020-19, issued on April 30, 2020, Governor Pritzker entered a new order, renewing, modifying, and updating and extending the Original Stay-at-Home Order ("***Updated Stay-at-Home Order***"). The Updated Stay-at-Home Order incorporates several changes and modifications to the Original Stay-at-Home Order, including: (i) approval for the playing of golf, but only in accordance with guidelines provided by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ("***DCEO***"); and (ii) a new requirement to wear face coverings in public places.

On March 16, 2020, I issued a supplemental order pursuant to the Declaration, prohibiting the operation of various businesses in the City, including "Clubs," as defined in the Highland Park Zoning Ordinance, and expressly prohibiting golf courses ("***March 16 Order***").

On April 17, 2020, I issued a supplemental order pursuant to the Declaration, requiring all persons over the age of two to wear face coverings, with specified limited exceptions ("***April 17 Order***"). The requirements of my April 17 Order are similar to, but not identical to, the face covering provisions of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order.

In light of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order, I have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the City and its residents to issue a supplemental emergency order as set forth below,

clarifying and updating my March 16 and April 17 Orders concerning the playing of golf and the wearing of face coverings.

In order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the City, and to further protect the residents of the City from disease and death, and pursuant to the authority set forth in the Declaration, Sections 11-1-6 and 11-20-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1- 6, 11-20-5; and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/11, I find that it is necessary to issue a supplemental emergency order as set forth below.

Except as expressly provided in this Supplemental Order, nothing in this Supplemental Order modifies or limits the actions and authority previously established by the Declaration or any of the orders that I previously issued pursuant to the Declaration.

Supplemental Order

I hereby direct and order as follows:


A. Golf. Notwithstanding my March 16 Order, golf may be played in the City, beginning on May 1, 2020, but only in strict compliance with the Updated Stay-at-Home Order and the guidelines provided by the DCEO.

B. Face Coverings. Notwithstanding any provision of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order to the contrary, all persons over the age of two are required to wear face coverings to the extent provided in the April 17 Order. Specifically, and without limitation of the foregoing, face coverings are required for all persons who are working at construction sites, automotive repair shops or engaged in landscaping activities. In the event of a conflict between the April 17 Order and the Updated Stay-at-Home Order, the stricter provision shall control.

This Supplemental Order will take effect on Friday, May 1, 2020 at 12:01 am, and run concurrently with the term of the Declaration of Civil Emergency unless rescinded or superseded by my order or a majority vote of the corporate authorities at any regular or emergency meeting thereof.
