- ➤ Staff first solicited nominations for the Awards program in Dec. 2022 w/deadline of Mar. 2023
- Nomination Categories:
 - 1) Rehabilitation
 - 2) Restoration
 - 3) Adaptive Reuse
 - 4) New Construction/Addition
 - 5) Landscape Restoration
- Panel consisted of three judges (Nancy Becker, Scott Javore, & Elliot Miller) who deliberated in early April 2023
 - All three nominations were awarded

278 Linden Park Place (c. 1868) — within the Linden Park Place local Historic District

- Rehabilitation award
- Owners: David Britton & Li Yun Wei
- Contributing Barn Cottage Home
 - Formerly a barn for 274 Linden Park Place
- Bridge identified as "Contributing Structure"
- Complete rehabilitation of timber 80 year-old bridge
 - Only means of entry/exit to property
- Awarded work:
 - > Reused bridge deck floor boards & doubled weight-barring capacity
 - > Used wooden columns & concrete foundation to strengthen underbelly of bridge
- > HPC approval March 2022

 - Wrap-around front porch
 - Turrets
 - Cornice & column detailing

Awarded work:

- Exterior painting, tuck-pointing & siding,
- Deck floor repair & porch hand rail installation
- Rear coach restoration
- Interior restoration
- ➤ HPC approval July 2018

- Owners: James & Abby Sayegh
- Tudor Revival home
- Architecturally significant elements:
 - Gabled front entry porch
 - Half timbering
 - Shed roof dormer
 - Scaled roof shingles

Awarded work:

- First floor dining room/second floor master bath addition
- Garage addition
- Rear patio addition
- Ordered materials to match existing façade
- Restored timber beams & roof shingles
- Extensive interior remodeling
- HPC approval April 2019
