Businesses are invited to sign on to the *Welcome Back Promise* by taking the following steps to create a healthy and comfortable environment for all:

- Capacity is limited per IDPH guidelines.
- High-touch surfaces are frequently cleaned.
- Employee health is monitored.

Restaurant Revitalization Fund Grants

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

FUND GRANTS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR RRF GRANTS?

Eligible entities who have experienced pandemic-related revenue loss include:



Restaurants, Food Stands, Food Trucks, Food Carts, Caterers, Bars, Saloons, Inn, Lounges, Taverns, Brewpub, Snack and Nonalcoholic Beverage Bars

Any restaurant or bar that is part of a publicly-traded company or owned by a state or local government is not eligible to apply. Owners that operate more than 20 restaurants are ineligible. (You are likely eligible if you are an owner of a franchise and do not control more than 20 locations).

HOW AND WHEN CAN I APPLY?

To apply, businesses will need to either go through point-of-sale (POS) restaurant partners, or they can apply directly through the SBA using an application portal.

No date has been set for the SBA online application portal launch yet.

You will need to complete the following: -SBA Form 3172 (Available for preview) -Additional documentation for verification (IRS Form 4506-T, Gross -Receipts Documentation, and possibly documents evidencing that onsite sales of food and beverage to the public comprise at least 33%

of gross receipts for 2019)



HOW MUCH CAN I GET FROM THE GRANT PROGRAM?



For businesses in operation for all of 2019, the max grant value will be:

GRANT AMOUNT = 2020 Gross Rev. - 2019 Gross Rev. - PPP Loan Amount

For businesses not operating for all of 2019, the max grant value will be:

GRANT AMOUNT = Avg. Monthly Gross Receipts in 2020 - Avg. Monthly Gross Receipts in 2019 - PPP Loan Amount

The maximum grant size will be \$5 million for restaurants and \$10 million for restaurant groups. The minimum amount can be \$1,000.

WHAT CAN GRANT FUNDS BE USED FOR?


The grants can be used on specific expenses which include: -Payroll costs

-Payments of principal or interest on any mortgage obligation -Rent payments, including rent under a lease agreement -Utilities

-Maintenance, including new outdoor seating construction -Supplies, including PPE and cleaning materials

-Food and beverage inventory







The American Rescue Plan Act recently established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) to provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses keep their doors open. The program will go live shortly.



Join the City, Park District of Highland Park, and Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) for a drive-thru Arbor Day event on Saturday, May 1, 9:00 - 11:00 AM at the downtown Highland Park train station (1700 St. Johns Ave.). Bike riders can also pedal up to a giveaways grab and go station at the event. Free confidential document shredding will be available, and giveaways will include native tree seedlings, plants, and seed packets.

Confidential Document Shredding Details

- Shredding will be available from 8:30 AM 11:30 AM, or until the truck is full.
- Shredding is limited to residents' personal confidential documents (taxes, bank/credit card statements/etc.)

- There is a limit of 4 banker-size boxes of confidential papers per person.
- **Do not** bring non-confidential papers, such as newspapers, coupons, and magazines. These may be safely recycled with your regular curbside recycling service.
- Please place documents for shredding in clearly labeled boxes in your trunk. Volunteers at the event will unload your trunk. You will not be able to stay or watch materials being shredded.
- This shredding event will not accept business documents, including home businesses. For other shredding options, visit *swalco.org*.

Financial Aid for Retailers and Restaurants Grant Program

The City of Highland Park has a matching grant program to assist restaurants and retailers with operational costs incurred to provide a safe environment for customers and staff in compliance with state and federal public health guidelines for the coronavirus pandemic. The program will accept applications from qualifying restaurants and retailers located and operating within a commercial building in Highland Park



with a net worth of less than \$2 million and generating less than an average of \$200,000 in profit per year for two years after taxes. Qualifying restaurants and retailers may apply for reimbursement of up to 50% of eligible expenses related to COVID-19 public health mitigations, to a maximum of \$10,000 for restaurants and \$5,000 for retailers, for costs incurred between August 15, 2020, and December 31, 2021, or until funds are depleted. *More information is available here*.
