CDC Issues Updated Mask Guidelines

CDC Director Dr. Rochelle Walensky provided a COVID-19 update at a press briefing on Tuesday, July 27. The CDC subsequently issued *updated mask guidelines* for areas experiencing substantial or high transmission, recommending that everyone, including fully vaccinated individuals, wear masks indoors. The updated guidance reflects concern regarding the increased transmissibility of the *Delta variant*.

The *Illinois Department of Public Health* fully aligns with the updated CDC guidance.

The CDC defines areas of substantial transmission to be those with 50 to 99 cases per 100,000 people over a 7-day period. Areas of high transmission are considered to be those with more than 100 cases per 100,000 people over a 7-day period. CDC has created a <u>heat map</u> of county-level metrics to help Americans make informed decisions about mask-wearing based on their county of residence or travel plans.

At this time, the CDC's heat map indicates that Lake County is experiencing a moderate level of community transmission. IDPH has not issued any additional recommendations for our county or region. However, as a reminder, at their discretion businesses may choose to implement masking requirements for their customers and employees, including those who are fully vaccinated.

Nominations for 2021 Mayor's Beautification Awards

The Business and Economic Development Advisory Group is currently accepting nominations for the 2021 Mayor's Beautification Awards. The Award recognizes Highland Park property owners and business owners that have made improvements to enhance visual appeal consistent with the environment and the



community. Given annually, award recipients will be granted a Mayoral Certificate; public recognition at a 2021 City Council Meeting, and publicity in *The Highlander*. Below is a list of business categories eligible for this award and the criteria by which businesses will be judged

Business Categories

Auto Dealership, Commercial / Mixed-Use Development, Service, Restaurant, and Retail.

Award Criteria

Appearance, Cleanliness, Consistency, Window Clarity, Code Adherence, Façade Condition, and Landscaping.

Sponsor-a-Planter Program

Through the <u>Sponsor-a-</u>

Planter Program, the City of Highland Park offers residents an opportunity to beautify the City's Central Business District and the Ravinia District by sponsoring one or more available municipal planters during the summer and fall seasons.



The City will recognize sponsors on a 5" x 7" placard featured in the planter, or sponsors may choose to recognize or memorialize an individual or family. The City will also recognize sponsors on its website.

To participate, residents pay an annual fee to the City for the flower planting and maintenance as well as the addition of the 5"x7" placard for one season (May—Nov). Planting will commence upon receiving the funds.

Annual cost of a planter sponsorship, including the placard:

- Large Planter: \$750 (Central Business District Only)
- Medium Planter: \$350
- Flower Pot: \$200

Financial Aid for Retailers and Restaurants Grant Program

The City of Highland Park has a matching grant program to assist restaurants and retailers with operational costs incurred to provide a safe environment for customers and staff in compliance with state and federal public health guidelines for the coronavirus pandemic. The program will accept applications from qualifying restaurants and retailers located and operating within a commercial building in Highland Park



with a net worth of less than \$2 million and generating less than an average of \$200,000 in profit per year for two years after taxes. Qualifying restaurants and retailers may apply for reimbursement of up to 50% of eligible expenses related to COVID-19 public health mitigations, to a maximum of \$10,000 for restaurants and \$5,000 for retailers, for costs incurred between August 15, 2020, and December 31, 2021, or until funds

are depleted. More information is available here.
