## **Business Development Strategic Plan**

During the <u>Committee of the Whole</u> meeting on August 23, 2021, Assistant City Manager Rob Sabo provided an update on the existing Business Development Strategic Plan, as well as an overview of planning activities to be undertaken this fall in support of developing a new plan for 2022-2024. The presentation highlighted achievements of the current plan, including:

- zoning changes to stimulate development and attract new businesses;
- administrative changes to simplify and increase the efficiency of permitting processes;
- streetscape improvements in the Ravinia District including improved lighting, signage, and seating;
- communications and marketing initiatives across print and digital modalities;
- sustainability initiatives;
- financial assistance and sales tax incentive programs to support business and property owners during the pandemic and beyond.

Objectives for the new plan include:

- identifying development, redevelopment, and repositioning opportunities;
- enhancing local and regional partnerships;
- evaluating land uses and parking;
- augmenting communications, outreach, and marketing;
- pursuing additional efficiencies and improvements to City processes.

Business development stakeholders, including residents, businesses, and property owners will next be invited to provide feedback through focus groups and community outreach. Meetings are anticipated to be held this fall, with the new plan ready to be implemented in January 2022.

## Financial Aid for Retailers and Restaurants Grant Program

The City of Highland Park has a matching grant program to assist restaurants and retailers with operational costs incurred to provide a safe environment for customers and staff in compliance with state and federal public health guidelines for the coronavirus pandemic. The program will accept applications from qualifying restaurants and retailers located and operating within a commercial building in Highland Park with a net worth of less than \$2 million and generating less than an average of \$200,000 in profit per year for two years after taxes. Qualifying restaurants and retailers may apply for reimbursement of up to 50% of eligible expenses related to COVID-19 public health



mitigations, to a maximum of \$10,000 for restaurants and \$5,000 for retailers, for costs incurred between August 15, 2020, and December 31, 2021, or until funds are depleted. <u>More information is available here</u>.
