General Guidelines

- Have carts placed curbside by 7 AM on your scheduled service day.
- Keep carts on your property.
- Avoid placing heavy construction and demolition in your carts. Roll-off containers are available for jobs that involve heavy material.
- Backdoor customers: make sure carts are visible from the street and placed near the backdoor or garage.

Bulk Item Services and Spring Clean-Up

Residents are allowed to place one bulk item at curbside to be collected each week. This does not include white goods, such as appliances. No sticker or container is required for these bulk items. Note items must be under 50 pounds.

In addition to bulk item collection, LRS will provide an annual collection at no cost for large items, including white goods, during the months of April or May. Dates will be advertised well in advanced so that residents can prepare. Construction material will be limited to one cubic yard. Electronics will not be collected.

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- Independence Day
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day

During the holiday week, your scheduled service will be delayed by one day.

Residential Waste and Recycling Service Options

The City of Highland Park has entered into an agreement with Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) for residential waste and recycling collection. Residents have several options to choose from:

Curbside Volume-Based Service

Customers opting for this service will pay a monthly flat fee per 35 gallons of waste. The additional volume-based fee will be calculated through the use of RFID chips implanted in each refuse cart. Charges will be listed on quarterly invoices. Additional cans or bags of refuse must have a pre-paid refuse sticker attached in order to be collected.

Curbside Subscription Service (1 x week)

Residents who opt for this service will be provided either a 35 or 65 gallon refuse cart by LRS. Garbage that does not fit in the cart provided must have a refuse sticker attached to it. Additional cans or bags of refuse must have a pre-paid refuse sticker attached in order to be collected.

Refuse Stickers

Refuse stickers are only required for yard waste and additional waste that does not fit in provided containers. Residents can purchase stickers at City Hall and several local grocery and hardware stores.

Electronic Waste

Highland Park residents can enjoy the convenience of recycling certain electronics at their curb. LRS will collect one large electronic or three small electronic items on the first collection day of each month. Allowable items include televisions, monitors, computers and printers. White goods (fridge, freezer, etc.) are not accepted. Please contact LRS to arrange special pick-up for such items.

Hazardous Waste

Hazardous material, including paint, mineral spirits, chemicals, gasoline, oil, poison, pesticides, cleaning materials, among others, may not be disposed of as part of household waste. For more information on how to properly dispose of these items, please call the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) at 847.336.9340, or visit swalco.org.

Highland Park Recycling Center

As a courtesy to its residents, Highland Park offers a complimentary program in which electronics, Styrofoam, textiles, bulbs and batteries may be collected at no charge when dropped off.

The Recycling Center is located at 1180 Half Day Rd.

Composting and Yard Waste Services

Residents are encouraged to participate in the City's composting and yard waste initiative, which is available April 1— December 15. Two options are available:

Option One: Once-per-week subscription service. Service will occur on the same day as your refuse and recyclables collection, and use a 35-gallon container. Residents that choose this option will be charged a seasonal fee.

Option Two: Volume-based service. Under this program the resident will be required to attach a refuse sticker to their 35 gallon container provided by LRS. Containers will be provided only by request. Please contact LRS at **773.685.8811** to arrange delivery.

- Fruits and vegetables
- Leftovers and kitchen scraps
- Breads, grains, pasta and cereal
- Meat, poultry and seafood
- Dairy and eggs
- Paper products
- Plant trimmings

Items Not Accepted

- Diapers
- Pet waste
- Oil
- Recyclables (put in recycling container)
