On 09/05/19 at approximately 10am, Ofc White and I responded to [REDACTED] for a well being check reported by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that during [REDACTED] on today's date, that he fully disclosed that [REDACTED] Robert E. Crimo III, had made a threat in the household. [REDACTED] informed [REDACTED] that Robert stated that he was going to kill everyone. [REDACTED] informed [REDACTED] that he was afraid to go home due to the nature of this threat and that [REDACTED] had a collection of knives in his bedroom.

Upon making contact with Robert Crimo III and his mother, Denise M. Pesina, Robert admitted to being depressed on Monday 09/02/19 and having a history of drug use. Robert was not forthcoming as to the language that he used on Monday nor was his mother Denise. We were then joined by Sgt. Olson on scene. After speaking to Robert E. Crimo III's father, Robert Crimo , it was learned that the collection of knives belong to him. Robert Crimo then agreed to turn over the collection of 16 knives that were being stored in a tin can lunch box, along with a 12 inch dagger, and a 24 inch Samurai type blade in Robert E. Crimo III's bedroom closet for safekeeping. Robert E. Crimo III was asked if he felt like harming himself or others with Robert answering No. Robert E. Crimo III, was informed that if he needed any police and/or medical assistance to contact us. Mother, Denise, was present and also informed [REDACTED]

I then responded to the psc to enter the property into the BEAST for safekeeping.

After keeping [REDACTED] updated on the incident, [REDACTED] informed me that they were going to contact [REDACTED]

While at the psc, at approximately 2:15pm, father Robert Crimo showed up to pickup his property with Evidence Custodian Mike Solesky being present to release the items.

It is the duty of law enforcement officials and school administrator to report to the Department of State Police when a student or other person is determined to pose a clear and present danger to themselves, or to others, **within 24 hours** of the determination. 20 Il. Admin. Code 1230.120,

This form must be completed in its entirety by the law enforcement official, principal, chief administrative officer, or their designee making the determination. **Clear and present danger reporting shall be used by the Department of State Police to identify persons who, if granted access to a firearm or firearm ammunition, pose an actual, imminent threat of substantial bodily harm to themselves or another person(s) that is articulable and significant or who will likely act in a manner dangerous to public interest.**

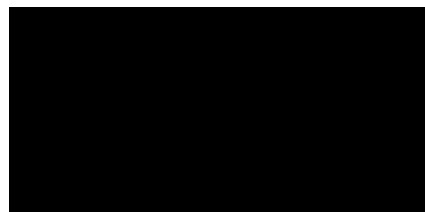
