Each entry in this report contains the CAD entry, the evidence information, what metadata was added (if any), and the reason for the action. For example, the last 5 columns are 'Added Categories', 'Added Tags', 'Added CAD/RMS ID', 'Added Location', and 'Match

Reason'. Any of the 'Added' columns can be blank, which means that particular piece of metadata was not added.

For the 'Match Reason', the following values can occur:

E.com ID was not defined: the ID on the evidence already is invalid (this implies a full update)

E.com ID matches the CAD/RMS ID: The ID on the evidence matched the ID from the CAD entry (implies a full update)

E.com already has a valid ID: The ID on the evidence already is valid and is different than the CAD/RMS ID from the entry (this implies nothing is done)

Unmatched CAD Report

This reports shows all the CAD entries that did not have any matching videos, and why. Possible reasons:

Badge Id does not exist in <u>evidence.com</u>: This error is due to the officer not having an active <u>Evidence.com</u> account. The Badge ID in the CSV file needs to match that officers Badge ID in <u>Evidence.com</u> to properly correlate the video with the event. Desperate Sri Lanka Turns to Russia for Lifeline

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has asked Russian President Vladimir Putin for some of his sanctioned oil, he confirmed Thursday. Rajapaksa, who spoke to Putin by phone, said he had thanked Russia for its help in the past and hoped this would continue. "I requested an offer of credit support to import fuel," he tweeted. Foreign exchange reserves in the country have been dropping for years off the back of economic mismanagement, leaving Sri Lanka ill-prepared to deal with the current fuel crisis. Even so, few petroleum firms have been willing to ship much-needed fuel in for months as outstanding bills pile up. (Source: Al Jazeera)

FBI, MI5 Sound China Alarm in First-Ever Joint Address

FBI Director Christopher Wray spoke alongside MI5 head Ken McCallum in an unprecedented joint appearance in London. McCallum warned that the British Security Service's work investigating Chinese activity had more than doubled in the last three years — and is expected to double again. Across the Atlantic, the view is equally dire. Wray cautioned that an attempt by China to seize Taiwan would "represent one of the most horrific business disruptions the world has ever seen." Mecca Pilgrim Turnout Approaches Pre-COVID Numbers

Saudi Arabia is welcoming the first of the pilgrims, with hajj officially beginning Thursday night. Around 1 million worshippers are expected to make the trip, including 850,000 from abroad. That's still down on the pre-pandemic 2.5 million in 2019, but higher than the past two years. Health Class

White Children Especially Likely to Be Overdiagnosed With ADHD

A new study also found white kids are more likely to be overtreated for attentiondeficit/hyperactivity disorder than their nonwhite peers. Researchers studied 1,070 American schoolchildren who had previously shown strong academic, social and behavioral skills with the assumption that these students would be unlikely candidates for an ADHD diagnosis. They found that 27% of the white children were later diagnosed with ADHD, compared to 19% of nonwhite students. Neither age nor the socioeconomic status of the children's families made an impact on the data. ADHD diagnosis overall has increased in the last two decades from 6% to 10%. Nipsey Hussle's Killer Guilty of First-Degree Murder

The rapper was gunned down outside his Los Angeles store in March 2019 by acquaintance Eric Ronald Holder Jr., who has been convicted of first-degree murder after a weekslong trial. Hussle had made a name — and earned a Grammy — with his social justice-minded music. Holder admitted to killing him, but his lawyers argued it was in a "heated passion" and therefore manslaughter instead of murder. Prosecutors said Holder left the South Central L.A. location following an argument with Hussle before returning with two handguns and shooting him more than 10 times. He's set to reappear in court in September for sentencing. (Source: Billboard)

Smartphone Giant Launches 'Lockdown Mode' for the Security-Minded

It's an "extreme, optional" security level for users, Apple said, and most people will have no need to use it. But for activists, journalists and others in highly sensitive industries it may be a necessity. Recent research into the vulnerabilities of devices — highlighted with state-owned mercenary spyware Pegasus found on murdered journalist Jamal Khashoggi's phone — has inspired the features. Lockdown Mode blocks FaceTime calls and invitations from unknown sources, and disables link previews and some browser features, preventing exploitation by hackers. The setting has already appeared in the brand-new iOS 16 Developer Beta 3 update. (Sources: The Verge, Motherboard)







White Children Especially Likely to Be Overdiagnosed With ADHD

A new study also found white kids are more likely to be overtreated for attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder than their nonwhite peers. Researchers studied 1,070 American schoolchildren who had previously shown strong academic, social and behavioral skills with the assumption that these students would be unlikely candidates for an ADHD diagnosis. They found that 27% of the white children were later diagnosed with ADHD, compared to 19% of nonwhite students. Neither age nor the socioeconomic status of the children's families made an impact on the data. ADHD diagnosis overall has increased in the last two decades from 6% to 10%. (Source: The Conversation)

Nipsey Hussle's Killer Guilty of First-Degree Murder

The rapper was gunned down outside his Los Angeles store in March 2019 by acquaintance Eric Ronald Holder Jr., who has been convicted of first-degree murder after a weekslong trial. Holder admitted to killing him, but his lawyers argued it was in a "heated passion" and therefore manslaughter instead of murder. Prosecutors said Holder left the South Central L.A. location following an argument with Hussle before returning with two handguns and shooting him more than 10 times. Lockdown Mode blocks FaceTime calls and invitations from unknown sources, and disables link previews and some browser features, preventing exploitation by hackers. 





Mayor Lori Lightfoot revs up defense of her 6 mph speed camera tickets: Today's Juice



We're still two weeks out from the next City Council meeting but Mayor Lori Lightfoot is revving up talking points in hopes aldermen will hit the brakes on rolling back \$35 speed camera tickets for driving between 6 mph and 10 mph over the speed limit.

While the <u>contentious meeting</u> in which Lightfoot and her allies went toe-to-toe with Ald. Anthony Beale, 9th, and Ald. Ray Lopez, 15th, in a battle of deferrals may feel like a lifetime ago, it's only been two weeks.

And this piece of legislation is still top of mind in the City Council chamber. That was reflected in comments made on Wednesday at the ribbon cutting of the new Motor Row streetscape. And, as Fran

Spielman notes at the Sun-Times, Lightfoot has switched gears.

After the City Council's Finance Committee <u>advanced a measure</u> to roll back the speed camera ticket threshold despite Lightfoot's protest, the mayor blasted Beale, Lopez and others, <u>tweeting</u>, "At a time when we have seen a 15% increase in traffic fatalities over two years, including 174 deaths in 2021 alone, it is unconscionable that any City Council member would consider voting for increased speeds near spaces by our children."

On Wednesday, though, it was revenue dollars that the mayor used to leverage her point. The speeding tickets Lightfoot wants to keep generated nearly \$60 million in 2021.

And while Lightfoot continued to use safety data to defend the tickets on Wednesday, she also proved she isn't afraid to drop a tax threat when it comes to making up that revenue.

According to the Sun-Times, Lightfoot suggested raising property taxes before next year's city elections to bridge the gap, saying, "Agreeing with Alderman Beale is about an \$80 million proposition when you combine the loss for this year and next year."

Beale's not buying it, though, and took a swipe at the mayor, saying, again per the Sun-Times, that the money can be found "from the same programs that she's using to give out gas cards and Ring doorbells and all of her pet projects that she's attempting to use during an election year to buy votes."

So here we are again, back in the midst of a mayor-council donnybrook, one that's already generated more heat than the resistance that was put up against then-Mayor Daley's <u>disastrous parking meter deal</u>.

A bruising fight—especially one she might lose—is not what Lightfoot wants or needs as her reelection campaign gets underway. But we already know she's not one to back down or <u>tread lightly</u>. So, in the coming weeks ahead of the next City Council meeting on July 20, get ready for Lightfoot, her allies and her opponents to kick the rhetoric into overdrive.



Pritzker picks up more national notice, by Greg Hinz



Gov. J.B. Pritzker keeps insisting he's running for re-election as governor and not president in 2024,

but the national media is joining Chicago reporters in suspecting something else.

Take a look at yesterday's <u>big Washington Post piece</u>, the one headlined, "As some Democrats grow impatient with Biden, alternative voices emerge." It's all about how Pritzker and fellow Democratic Gov. <u>Gavin Newsom of California</u> have been much <u>harsher in their verbiage</u> about the need for gunlaw change than Biden in the wake of the Highland Park shooting and other gun tragedies.

Concluded the Post: "As the Democratic rank-and-file's thirst for a more combative attitude becomes increasingly evident, other party leaders are beginning to showcase an alternative tone, one that goes far more sharply at Republican attitudes and tactics." Just like Pritzker did.

With GOP gubernatorial nominee Darren Bailey <u>continuing to stumble</u> on the issue, look for more of the same from the incumbent.

- What's next for Anna Valencia? After losing her primary bid for Secretary of State to Alexi Giannoulias, Valencia is now weighing whether or not to run for re-election for her current job as City Clerk, where she could face another tough challenge.
- <u>The latest from Highland Park</u>: Robert E. "Bobby" Crimo III is being held without bond as prosecutors disclosed he confessed to firing more than 80 shots from a Highland Park rooftop and revealed he drove to Wisconsin with a plan to attack again.

Q: With all the recent controversial Supreme Court decisions, can our school restrict what the students wear even if it expresses a political message?

A: Maybe. The Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals has acknowledged that a school can justify restrictions on speech activities if the school can show that the speech "would materially and substantially disrupt the work and discipline of the school" or invade the rights of others. That standard was established in a previ-ous U.S. Supreme Court case called Tinker v. Des Moines Independent Comm. Sch. Dist, involving a First Amendment challenge to school policies that prohibited students from wearing black armbands to express opposition to the Vietnam War. For your school to enforce a policy that restricts certain messages on clothing it will have to survive analysis under this legal framework.





Highland Park - ITC: Psychosocial training and support

The horrific shooting incident on nation's celebration day in Highland Park, IL deeply shocked the whole community— the ripple effect of this incident impacts many in different ways. Many will heal but for some individuals and families this event will remain a traumatic experience for a long time and the community will need some time to recover as well.

Over the next few days, the response, both operational and psychosocial, will transition from the immediate phase to providing a mid to long-term response, requiring comprehensive coordination, deliberate planning of emotional support provision to various circles of impact along the timeline, including identification of needs for these phases and availability of recourses.

In light of the reality described above, and based on our experience in supporting the psycho-social response to multiple incidents in Israel and around the world, the following steps are recommended:

- Identification, mapping and scoping of needs of different groups of people
 impacted by the incident in various intensity (families that lost their loved ones,
 survivors, parents/children of missing and dead, community institutions such
 as schools, first responders, clinicians, hospitals, faith leaders and careproviders etc.) including the projection of those needs' development along
 time, including various time marks (end of forensic procedures, funerals, back
 to school, holidays and so on).
- Identification, mapping and scoping of psycho-social support resources (it should be kept in mind that such a transition also comes with withdrawal of "helping hands" that will be so useful during the first days and gradual decrease in availability of outside help). Also the initial response is always characterized by certain level of duplications and gaps, due to the fact that multiple organizations are "jumping in" to help, not always in a most coordinated way.
- Development of mid and long term, detailed and coordinated plan for prolonged psycho-social response, based on development of common language, utilizing all available community resources (not only mental health professionals), progressing from short-term interventions, targeting acute trauma to full rehabilitation, focusing on the strength and resilience of the community and its members.

From our perspective and experience, the recommended way to deal with these challenges is via a comprehensive systematic community approach that enables all local agencies and stakeholders, formal and informal, to share their knowledge and resources and integrate their actions in favour of the community so that a continuum of care can be created in a shared language and culture of services.



The following topics are part of ITC expertise, experience and recommendations in psycho-social response following traumatic events

- Augmentation of local experts' capacity in trauma focused care for individuals, families and groups including but not limited to -
 - Tools for provision of non-stigmatized direct care from the acute phase onwards, for individuals and families.
 - Diagnosis, triage and initial intervention principles, models and modules for Acute Stress Reaction (ASR) / Acute Stress Disorder (ASD) as well as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
 - Trauma focused evidence based techniques
 - Practical skills on psycho-social interventions in traumatic stress situations
 - Identification, mitigation and management of compassion fatigue and burn-out symptoms amongst first responders and care providers including self care
 - Treating grief and bereavement
 - Development of a continuum of services to deal with psycho-trauma and rehabilitation.
- Support in development of community resilience restoration plan, empowering
 and training the formal and informal leadership and professional services in the
 areas of health, welfare, education and community (including faith leaders) as
 well as local NGOs by training trainers and creating a cascade model of
 providing psycho education.
- Development and implementation of non-stigmatized emotional support mechanism and language to address the well being of first responders and care providers, that were or are involved in the incident, focusing on mitigation and decrease of burn-out and compassion fatigue levels among those.



Potential audiences for ITC training may include:

- Executives City of Highland Park leadership and heads of departments and services, lay leaders, first responders' management and team leaders, administration, HR etc.
- Psycho-social care providers psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers and therapists.
- Community and faith leaders.
- Educational system administration and personnel (school directors, teachers, pre-school educators, camp directors and camp counselors).
- NGO and volunteer based organizations administration and practitioners.
- Operators of Hotlines and other support services specifically established or utilize to provide response to current incident (including self-care practices).

Potential topics for training:

Participants will be introduced to the guidelines of intervention during emergencies, common behaviors of the population and effective methods of assistance.

Community leadership:

- · Language of trauma
 - Continuities
 - The time continuum in emergency and trauma
 - Normal reactions along the time continuum
- Assessment of impacted population's behavior and needs in emergencies and applicable response tools.
 - Population behavior and needs in emergency
 - Circles of impact and vulnerable populations
- Principles of community resilience
- Self care Principles of continuity on personal and community levels,
 emotionally support and preservation of personnel, the preservation of the



team, mitigation of burn-out and compassion fatigue and professional well being.

Therapists/Counselors/Social workers:

- Identification, mapping and intensity of subject of intervention's emotional state.
- Identification of available resources that can be used for successful intervention.
- Professional resilience tools for prevention and mitigation of burn-out and compassion fatigue among care-providers.
- · Psychological first-aid model
- Diagnosis, triage and initial intervention principles, models and modules for Acute Stress Reaction (ASR) / Acute Stress Disorder (ASD) as well as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Emotional containment and coping resources during and following crisis event.
 The multi-Dimensional model of Coping and Resilience "Basic Ph"
- Principles, process and components of psycho-social intervention's planning and implementation.
- · Grief and bereavement
- · Parents and children

Education institutions leadership and counselors

- Psycho-social support to students impacted by stressful incident
- The impact of crisis and traumatic experiences on children and parents, stress, anxiety and trauma among children on age continuum.
- Screening for trauma symptoms among students
- Providing emotional first-aid to students
- Basic interventions with students / parents
- Support for professionals- professional quality of life -- coping with secondary traumatization and compassion fatigue.

Spiritual leaders



- Role of spiritual leaders in preservation of personal and community resilience in emergency
- Language of trauma core terms, models and approaches in the field
- Emotional first-aid
- · Principles of continuity on personal and community levels

First responders

- Ability to offer first emotional aid on grounds
- Self care how to emotionally support and preserve the personnel, the preservation of the team, compassion fatigue and professional well being.

Business owners

- Understanding the psychosocial world of victims of terror/disaster.
- Creating in service support for employees that are impacted by the emergency and their families.
- Self care how to emotionally support and preserve the personnel, professional well being.

The principles of ITC work are the focus on strengths (the salotogenic approach), the focus on the continuum between individuals and the community, working with the cascade model – training trainers, understanding trauma and bereavement on the time continuum and the age continuum, working to create a shared language of response.

The program for each training segment will be designed specifically for target audience roles in the community in general and specifically in crisis. Final content will be agreed upon in a dialogue with partners; however, each course will contain some if not all of the topics mentioned below.

This program is practical and based on active participation and dialogue, includes simulations and exercises.



It is conducted by 2 ITC experts over the course of 4-5 consequent days.


