The suspect in the mass shooting that killed seven and injured dozens more Monday at a Chicago suburb's Independence Day parade is being charged with seven counts of first-degree murder, Lake County State's Attorney Eric Rinehart said Tuesday evening. Rinehart called the shootings in Highland Park a premeditated attack.

> Thank you so much for starting a meal train for The Goldstein Family. Just wanted to alert you that your best intentions could open the door for a safety issue for the family.

>

> We have seen this happen in the past. In fact, we've lived it. One mother of a murdered child ended up having to open her mail with rubber gloves because her address ended up on social media.

>

> There are a lot of crazy people out there. We have suggested guidelines that worked pretty well in Parkland, that kept victims safe while being able to provide meals.

>

> Please, if you would, consider this for protecting this family. Again, thank you for your kind and beautiful heart. No doubt you are pure intentioned and compassionate.

>

> If you would like to speak to someone about this, please let me know, and I will hook you up with one of the organizers of meal trains after the shooting in Parkland. It kept families safe, fed and maintained privacy. He is on our board.

> This is how Parkland did it:

> Meal Trains

> When organizing meal trains for victims and/or family members, it is important to keep addresses private and off the Internet for public consumption for the sake of the victim bases' safety. In Parkland, we found multiple times that people would sign up to "help" for meal trains with an ulterior motive to gain the victims' families and survivors' addresses for their own personal gain. To avoid this, we had multiple volunteers set up on a nightly basis to truly help on the meal train. We had a volunteer pick up from the restaurant, then hand the food off to another person Authorized by the families to have the home address and deliver the food to the location. This maintains privacy.

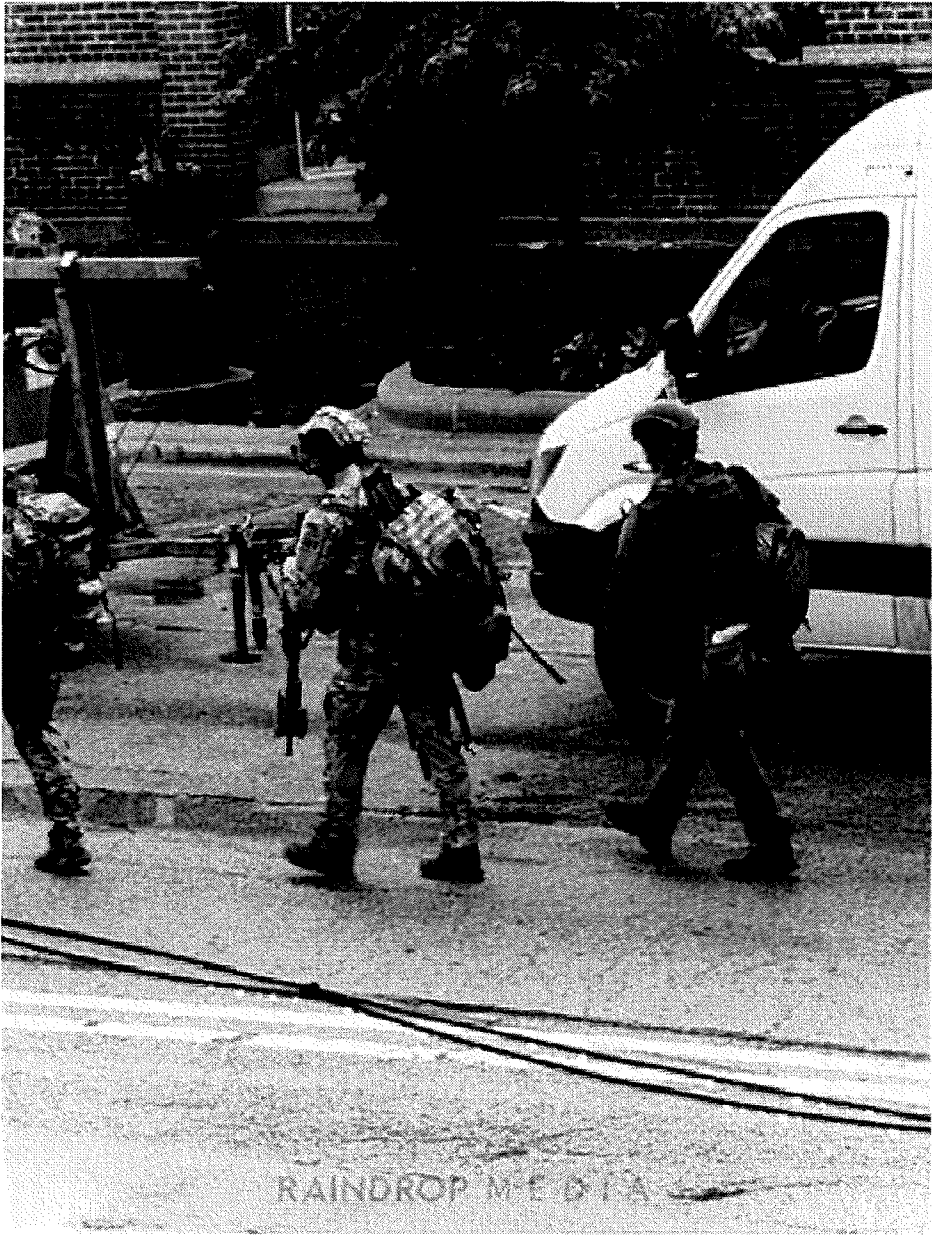

Hello, Sammy-

First, thank you for handling everything so well today. It must have been horribly wrenching, but you had us all well taken care of.

If you or others at the Village of Glencoe are reaching out to Highland Park, could you please remind them that Paws for Patrick is here for them?

In fact, therapy dogs were shipped to Uvalde, TX after the school shooting and we're fortunate to have dozens of therapy dogs within miles of Highland Park ready to help those who need it. We've also found people have contacted us about getting an emotional support animal within hours of experiencing their own unthinkable tragedy and we're here for that, too, and want people to know that.

Highland Park has been a great supporter of Paws for Patrick and we have a strong relationship, but the circumstances may challenge making the connection that can make a difference. I'm told City Manager Ghida Neukirch is who we should talk to, but I haven't yet found a way of making contact that I think will be heard through the noise. Maybe there's someone else we should contact - not sure.

Either way, we know therapy dogs and emotional support animals can make a critical difference in this sort of situation sooner than some think, and we want to do whatever we can to let that happen. Any thoughts you may have or contacts that can get us closer to helping are much appreciated.

The tattoos worn by Robert E. Crimo, III and his Twitter logo @awakerip (now closed account) appear to me to be modified "Kek" symbols. The "Kekistan Movement" is described and a picture of a flag used by the movement is included in the following Southern Poverty Law Center (SPLC) article:

[What the Kek: Explaining the Alt-Right 'Deity' Behind Their 'Meme Magic' | Southern Poverty Law Center \(splcenter.org\)](https://www.splcenter.org/What-the-Kek-Explaining-the-Alt-Right-Deity-Behind-Their-Meme-Magic)



Crimo's now closed @awakerip Twitter account logo appears to me to be a modified version of the complete "Kek" logo found in the center of the "Kekistan" flag pictured at the SPLC link above. The hashmark tattoo on his face below his right eye appears to me to be a representation of the central symbol in the center of the "Kek" logo comprised of five vertical lines with opposing arrows, which appears to me that Crimo represented on his facial tattoo with four vertical lines and a horizontal crossing line. Additionally, you will note the leaves on the top of the pictured "Kekistan" flag, and Crimo appears to me to have similar leaves tattooed on his neck.

Just sharing my personal observation in the interest of your investigation. I am NOT an authority on such symbols, and I may be wrong but perhaps your investigators should consider the possibility of a connection between Crimo and the "Kek" movement.

For ongoing perspective about Crimo's artistic interests you may consider reviewing the ongoing Twitter conversations between Twitter account @1cowtools who is an admitted music collaborator with Crimo and the Twitterverse.

I was stationed at Great Lakes Naval Station in the 1970s, and I have good memories of the warm hearted, mid-Westerners I met in Lake County, ultimately earning 3 Honorable Discharges for varied U.S. military service. Hopefully, your local task force will resist the impulse to "sweep embarrassing shit under the rug" and do a thorough investigation because the good people of your county deserve nothing less.

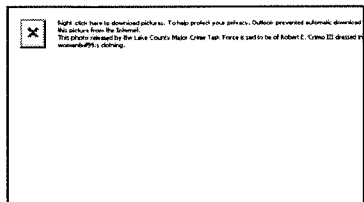

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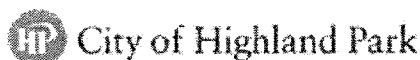

Greetings Mayor Rotereng. I will be brief as I'm sure you are sifting through thousands of emails - both supportive and combative - after the July 4 tragedy. I went to NU with your husband Rob. Also, a frat brother, up until recently, owned the New Balance store on Central. I often shopped there and can't even fathom how such a beautiful area could be the site of such carnage.

This situation has, like it or not, made you a public figure due to your appearances on CNN, NBC, etc. I'm sure you and the residents of Highland Park are focusing on healing and moving on, as you should. However, I feel that, by keeping the incident front and center, with you as a spokesperson, this might be the incident that lets our gun loving Congress know they are out of excuses. Obviously, the "fewer doors" argument is moot since the shooter was on a rooftop. The "more mental health resources" argument is also moot because it appears mistakes were made and warning signs missed with Mr. Crimo. Hey, mistakes happen in an overwhelmed system. We both know that getting rid of guns will always be the only solution and Congress needs to admit it and take action.

Dear Friends –

Tragedy struck my hometown of Highland Park on the Fourth of July, as my city became the latest to experience the horror of a mass shooting event. Like many residents here, I've gotten to know a number of the men and women on the Highland Park police force, including Chief Lou Jogmen, Commander Chris O'Neill, officers April Prete, Ginger Stokes and numerous other officers and personnel. They are a vital, vibrant and active part of our community, universally respected. We see them on our streets and in our stores, coffee shops and restaurants. We interact with them at local sporting events, concerts, farmers markets, art and food festivals. They bring pride and care to every job to which they are assigned.

We've always known how hard they work to keep us safe, but never imagined that their bravery would be put to this kind of test. After all, we are a small city of roughly 30,000 people and, you know, "this kind of thing never happens

here.” But as the video footage shows, while people were running for their lives, Highland Park police officers were putting theirs on the line, running directly towards the shooter. No one who lives here will ever forget their courage that day. We are so incredibly fortunate to have such dedicated law enforcement professionals in our city.

A few years ago, I was commissioned by HPPD to create this “Highland Park Police Time After Time” commemorative piece, featuring HPPD officers from 1932 and 2019. It was an honor to pay tribute to our police department in this way, one I will always treasure.

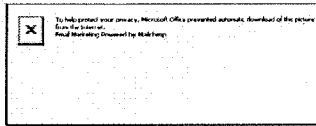

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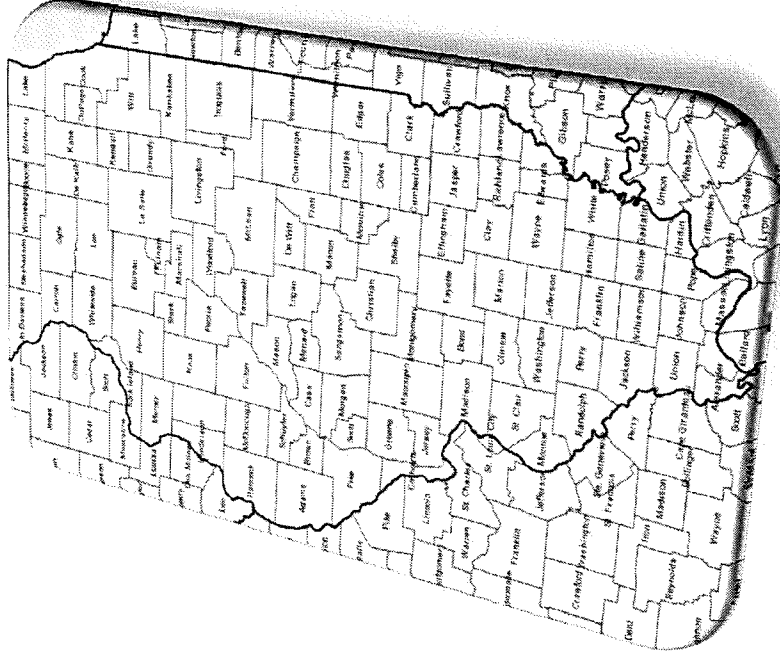

 - Highest potential will be in central and southern Illinois, where 2 to 3 inches of additional rain are possible.



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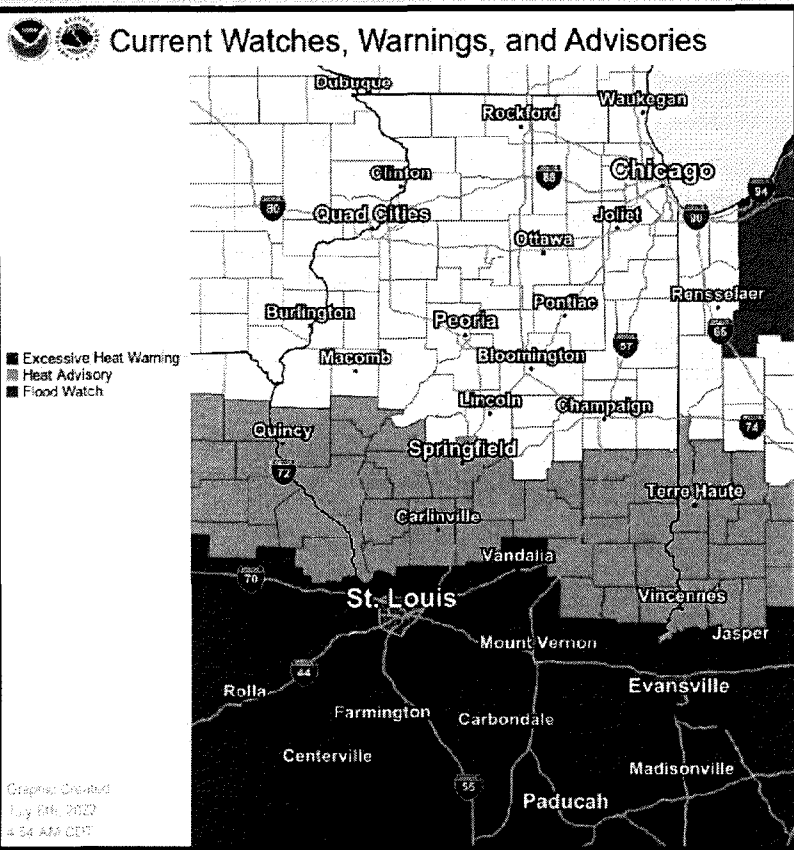

Today's Chances of Specific Weather Type Within 25 Miles



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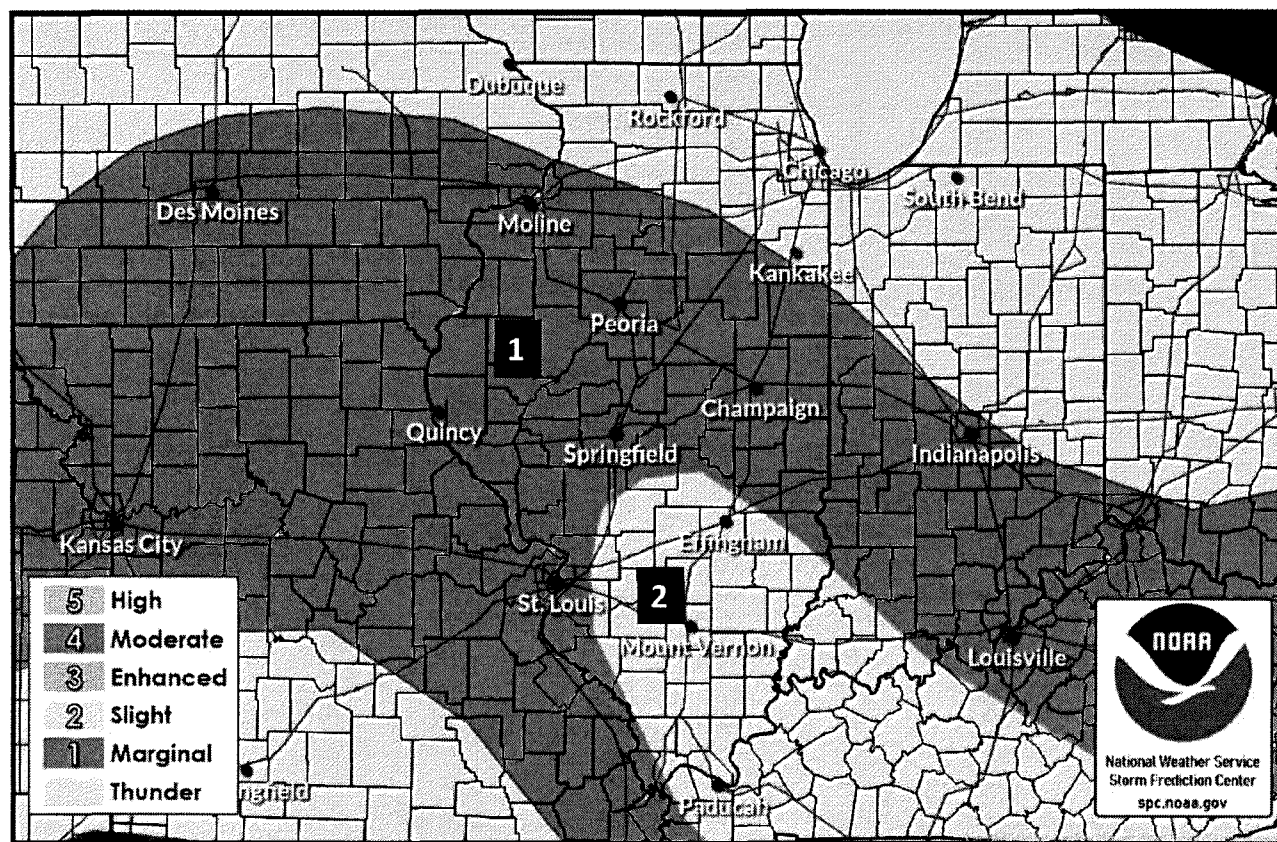

Tomorrow's Chances of Specific Weather Type Within 25 Miles



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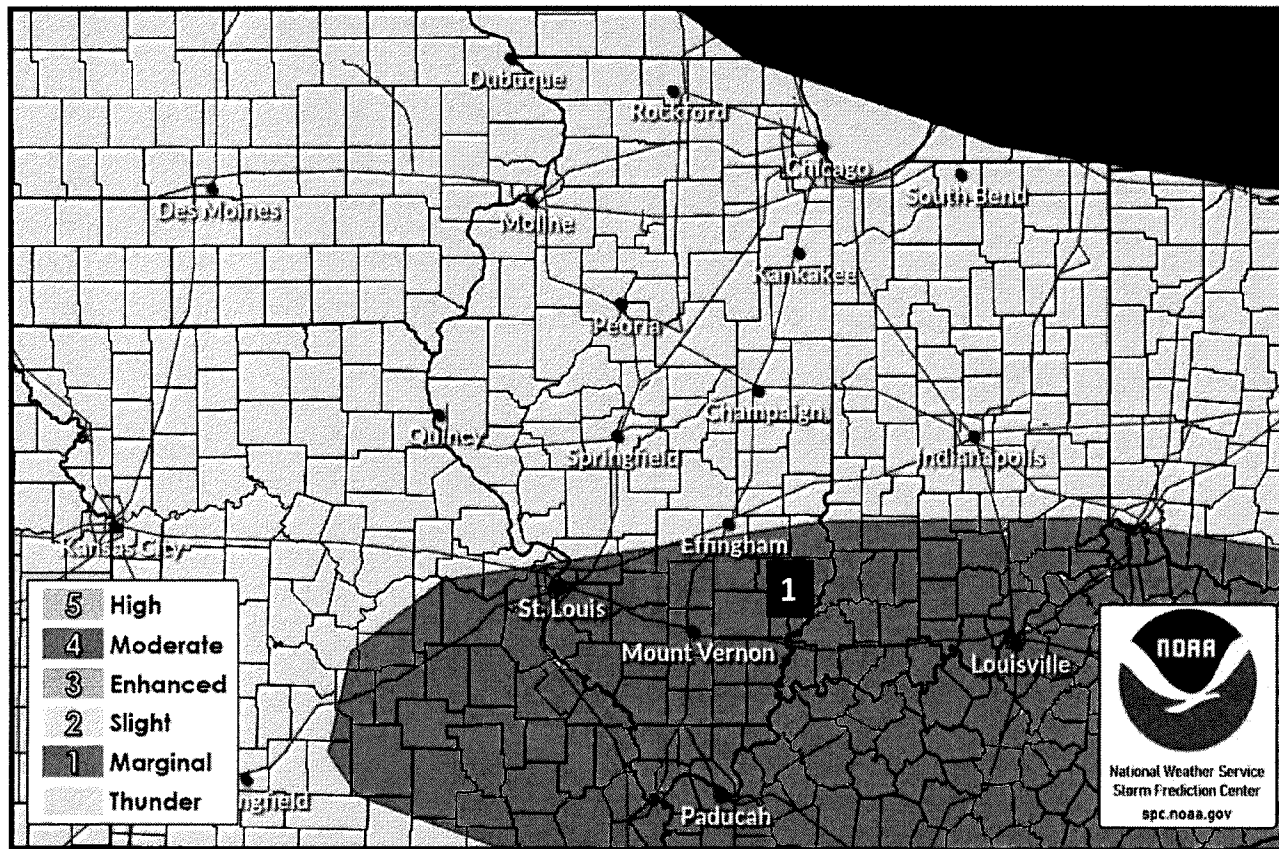

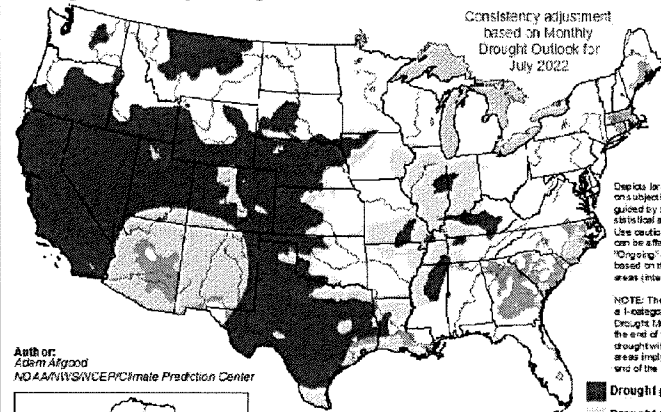

HIGHLAND PARK SHOOTING

CHICAGO – In September 2019, ISP received a Clear and Present Danger report on the subject from the Highland Park Police Department. The report was related to threats the subject made against his family. There were no arrests made in the September 2019 incident and no one, including family, was willing to move forward on a complaint nor did they subsequently provide information on threats or mental health that would have allowed law enforcement to take additional action. Additionally, no Firearms Restraining Order was filed, nor any order of protection.

At that time of the September 2019 incident, the subject did not have a FOID card to revoke or a pending FOID application to deny. Once this determination was made, Illinois State Police involvement with the matter was concluded.

Then, in December of 2019, at the age of 19, the individual applied for a FOID card. The subject was under 21 and the application was sponsored by the subject's father. Therefore, at the time of FOID application review in January of 2020, there was insufficient basis to establish a clear and present danger and deny the FOID application.

HIGHLAND PARK SHOOTING

CHICAGO – In September 2019, ISP received a Clear and Present Danger report on the subject from the Highland Park Police Department. The report was related to threats the subject made against his family. There were no arrests made in the September 2019 incident and no one, including family, was willing to move forward on a complaint nor did they subsequently provide information on threats or mental health that would have allowed law enforcement to take additional action. Additionally, no Firearms Restraining Order was filed, nor any order of protection.

At that time of the September 2019 incident, the subject did not have a FOID card to revoke or a pending FOID application to deny. Once this determination was made, Illinois State Police involvement with the matter was concluded.

Then, in December of 2019, at the age of 19, the individual applied for a FOID card. The subject was under 21 and the application was sponsored by the subject's father. Therefore, at the time of FOID application review in January of 2020, there was insufficient basis to establish a clear and present danger and deny the FOID application.

I would like to send our heartfelt condolences to you and the entire Highland Park Community.

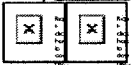
We are horrified and saddened by the news of the July 4 shooting and the devastating toll including loss of life and terrible injuries.
