AR TRIGGER DIFFERENCES

When Eugene Stoner originally designed the AR platform, shooters were forced to use what is known as a "mil-spec" trigger. This trigger was designed as a do-it-all trigger with combat applications in mind. Once the aftermarket AR trigger was introduced, shooters gained the ability to customize their AR to suit their specific needs.

Which drop-in trigger is best for your build? Before you decide, let's examine the differences between three types of AR triggers: single-stage, captive two-stage, and independent two-stage triggers.

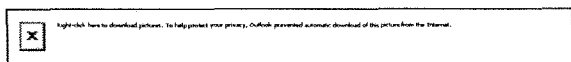


Single-Stage Trigger

One of the common triggers found on the market is a single-stage trigger. This is the type of trigger found in mil-spec AR 15 rifles. While

this type of trigger, sear engagement is the obstacle preventing the hammer from heading toward the firing pin. As soon as the trigger-pull starts, the trigger sear is already pushing against the hammer sear on its way to the break.

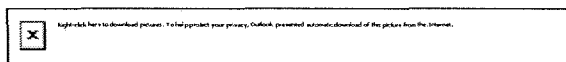
A good single-stage trigger, such as the Rave 140, RA-434 HPT, BLITZ Blackout or RA-535 APT, will have a well-designed and finely finished sear engagement. These triggers have no take-up or overtravel, while providing a crisp snap once the hammer breaks free of the trigger sear.

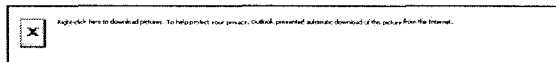
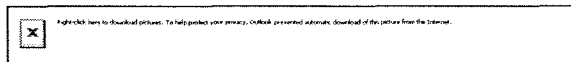

Depending on use, trigger pull weight can vary in single-stage designs. AR trigger pull weights are measured in pounds. Mil-spec triggers typically have a pull weight between 5.5 and 8.5 pounds. So, too, can distance be varied in these designs. Mil-spec triggers typically have quite a bit of travel both before and after a trigger break. Meanwhile, competition-style triggers have overall trigger travel measured in fractions of an inch.

Lightweight, single-stage triggers are the gold standard when it comes to competition and are what many shooters prefer. However, they aren't necessarily the perfect choice for everyone. Some don't like that the gun fires so soon after pulling the trigger. However, a long, heavy trigger pull increases the likelihood of the shooter disturbing the rifle and pulling the shot off target before a shot breaks.

Captive Two-Stage Trigger

Typically, a two-stage trigger provides a long first stage that allows the shooter to pull rearward until they hit the beginning of the second stage, at which time they can release the trigger or continue to pull to fire the shot. The two stages of a captive two-stage trigger are connected because the internal mechanisms are interconnected.

The benefit of a two-stage design is that it allows shooters to get into position and pre-stage their shots through the first stage. Once shooters hit the end of the first stage and they feel the wall that marks the start of the second stage, it allows them to finalize their shot placement, pause, and break through that wall to fire a shot. The short travel of the second stage helps ensure there's no shift in a shooter's grip that could cause them to come off target; this is a reality that isn't possible with a heavy-pulling version of a single-stage trigger.

With standard two-stage triggers, there's a give-and-take relationship between pull weight and crispness, so those with lower pull weights can feel mushy — both on the trigger's break and its reset. This is because both stages are interacting with the disconnecter. Captive two-stage triggers can also be at a disadvantage when rapid follow-up shots are necessary.

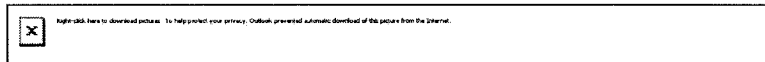
Independent Two-Stage Trigger

An independent two-stage trigger is a complete reimagining of the two-stage trigger platform. What exactly does that entail?

For starters, independent two-stage triggers have separate mechanical components for each stage. This separation removes the limitations of captive two stage triggers and provides numerous benefits to the shooter. From the distinct "wall" before the second stage to the crisp, clean break and fast reset, there are many performance benefits to explore.

An independent two-stage trigger provides flexibility and control, allowing the shooter to pause between the first and second stages, yet is has a crispness and reset speed that's similar to a single-stage trigger. Essentially, it has the benefits of a two-stage trigger without the disadvantages.

Everyone handles the stress and trauma of this event a little differently and some may require more assistance and support. When they divided up the groups I was told the classroom was for the non call back parade group and the other was for who responded to the callback and were not on scene. I wasn't sure where I fit in because I was already at the scene working when the callback went out. My situation was a bit different. I responded to the scene not being to far away. I arrived very fast and did everything I could to assist. I went to work right away. There were still some patients on scene and I wound up taking over the Lt's position on E32 briefly while the acting Lt went on an ambulance transport. I was there long enough while it was still an active scene and the shooter was still at large. I probably should have gone in the classroom with the group but wasn't sure. Today I know I could have benefited from it. If we have any more debriefings can you please consider me as someone who was on scene and can benefit from anything further.

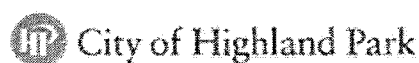

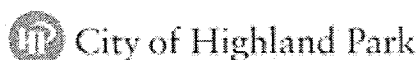

There are 158 businesses within the perimeter; 22 are restaurants/food businesses. Restaurants/food businesses incurred significant losses because of spoilage. Some paid their employees; some could not. The loss of business has impacted retailers, but still, they can sell their inventory of merchandise.

I've suggested to the businesses I spoke with that they contact their property owners to request a rent reduction for the days they couldn't operate. I could email the property owners to suggest it, but from the pandemic, I know Tabani and a few others waited until businesses received PPP and required their tenants to pay their rent in full.

I'll ask some businesses if their insurance will cover these losses and at what %, deductible... However, if they're covered, their premiums will increase - because that's what insurance companies do after a loss, and they'll be considered higher risk.

Both a grant program and a fund are needed to get our businesses back on track. I'd consider a grant program to cover 50% of food losses, but would need more information to make a recommendation.

Julie- Could finance assess the loss of revenue for each impacted business for one week based on their most recent quarterly sales taxes?

From what I am hearing personally, and seeing on social media, there is significant public support for our businesses, in and outside the community. There would have to be equitable distribution of funds to all the businesses, not just favorites. Timing is everything; setting up a fund for the public to contribute would have to be done quickly while there is worldwide attention.

Also, I know Walker Bros., Starbucks, Gearheads, and Bright Bowls sheltered people, but there may be others. Do we know all those businesses? It would be a grand gesture for the Mayor to contact those businesses and for the City to recognize them. Others outside the perimeter have also been very generous - they went beyond giving food prepared for an event that would have gone to waste. I don't know who they all are.

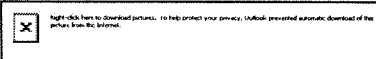
The Village of Glenview provides 911 dispatch services to several communities in the area, including Highland Park. The Glenview Public Safety Dispatch Center telecommunicators handled the emergency calls Monday and have continued to receive a significant amount of calls from the public in the following days. The Village also sent police and fire department resources to Highland Park in the moments and days following the attack.

The Village can proactively send alerts in the event of an emergency to all residents who create a Smart911 profile. Residents with an active profile received an alert Monday notifying them that the Village fireworks show had been canceled.

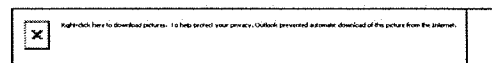


Smart911 is a free, online sign-up service for anyone with a phone -- mobile, landline or Voice Over IP (VOIP) -- and provides 9-1-1 dispatchers with information they need to help in an emergency. By creating a safety profile, telecommunicators and first responders will have all necessary information in case of an emergency for a more detailed, rapid response, such as pets in a home, vehicle description and emergency contacts.

Home and work addresses can also be linked to mobile phones, which do not provide an address to a 911 dispatcher.

Smart911 requires users to update their profile information every year to ensure an up-to-date user list. Visit smart911.com to update or create your safety profile.

Annexation of Allstate campus concludes nine-month process



The Village Board unanimously approved an annexation agreement with Allstate Corporation and Dermody Properties on Tuesday that concluded a nine-month process. Click the image below for a larger view of the timeline leading up to Tuesday's Board action.

The 290 acres to be annexed, formerly occupied by the Allstate campus, is on the far west side of the Village, west of the Tri-State Tollway. Most of the area was previously in unincorporated Cook County, and a 36-acre parcel is being disconnected from the City of Prospect Heights.

Last year, Allstate announced plans to sell portions of its corporate headquarters to Dermody Properties, a national developer with intentions of reinventing the property to a state-of-the-art logistics campus.

A fiscal impact study projects the development will generate more than \$134 million in new property tax revenue for local jurisdictions over the next 17 years. School Districts 31 and 225 stand to receive more than \$90 million in new revenue. The Village of Glenview and Glenview Public Library stand to receive more than \$15 million in new revenue during that span.

Cook County second installment property tax bills delayed

Cook County second installment property tax bills will be delayed and due at the end of the year instead of the usual Aug. 1 deadline.

Delays in the issuance of property tax bills are being attributed to the implementation of a new integrated property tax management system in Cook County.

The delay in 2021 second installment tax bills means homeowners (or their escrow) will have to be prepared to pay this 2021 property tax bill later this year and then be prepared again shortly after to pay their first installment 2022 bills in March 2023.

This meeting has been rescheduled from July 13 due to a clerical error in the legal notice that was published in the *Glenview Announcements*. In the coming days, the Village will publish and mail a new public hearing notice for the Aug. 10 meeting.

Additionally, the New Development Commission at its July 27 meeting intends to consider a text amendment to the B-1 and other commercial zoning district requirements that, if approved, would modify the list of permitted uses within those districts.

FBI Victim Assistance Center at Highland Park High School

The FBI has opened a Family Assistance Center (FAC) at Highland Park High School, offering support services and crisis assistance including counseling and mental health services, spiritual care, and financial assistance, if needed.

FAC services are available to anyone directly impacted by the events at the Highland Park 4th of July Parade. Victims are not just those who are physically injured, but also those who were present and may be experiencing emotional distress. All affected individuals and families should feel safe accessing services at the FAC, regardless of immigration status.

- Friday, June 8: 9 AM - 9 PM
- Saturday, June 9: TBD

Note: The entrance to receive services at Highland Park High School has moved from the main entrance on Vine Street to the H-Entrance. The H-Entrance is on the north side of the school, near St. Johns Avenue and Woodpath Lane. Only the H-Entrance will be open. All visitors will check in at the H-Entrance and per school standard operating procedures, anyone who is not a current District 113 student or staff member who wishes to take advantage of counseling services will need to provide a valid form of identification to be cleared to enter the school.

Please do not remove personal property left along the parade route as this is still an active investigation. A secure perimeter around the crime scene has been established:



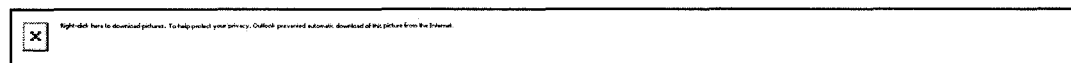
Retrieving items outside the secure perimeter:

Public Works has picked up items left along the parade route outside the secure area and placed them on the north lawn of City Hall, 1707 St. Johns Avenue. Items will be added as they are collected.

Retrieving items within the secure perimeter

Property within the secure area is being processed by the FBI to ensure that all relevant evidence is gathered. Items that are not being retained for evidence will be released as they are processed and may be picked up at the Family Assistance Center at Highland Park High School, 433 Vine Ave, Highland Park from 9:00 AM through 9:00 PM until Friday. Future dates and hours for item pick-up will be shared as it becomes available.

Items recovered from zones 1 and 5, items from the north side of zone 3, and limited items from zones 4 and 6 on the map below are available for pick-up at this time. There were no personal items recovered in area 2. Items at the intersection of Second and Central are not available for pick-up.
