Highland Park Police Department should consider installing PREA compliant shower curtains for each cell block. Doing so may reduce the occurrence of PREA related complaints should the showers need to be used by detainees.

**INSPECTOR COMMENTS:**

The lock-up is exceptionally clean and well organized. The department has ensured comprehensive policy and procedure that ensures a safe, secure, and humane facility.

- 1. The detention area consists of two blocks. Female block consist of three cells, with one being ADA compliant. Male block consist of 5 cells with one being ADA compliant. Each block includes a shower. All cells have audio and visual monitoring capabilities.
- 2. The booking area is equipped with Live Scan, first aid kit, and Narcan.
- 3. Arresting officer perform jail duties. This includes 30 minute personal observation.
- 4. Meals are provided by local restaurants when needed.
- 5. Anderson Pest solutions conduct monthly pest control
- 6. Nelbud conducts fire suppression systems inspection. The last inspection occurred on 09/20/2022.
- 7. Dependable Fire Equipment conducts annual inspection of fire extinguishers.
- 8. Highland Park Fire Department conducts inspections of the lock-up.
- 9. Shift supervisors conduct daily walk throughs of the lock-up.
